

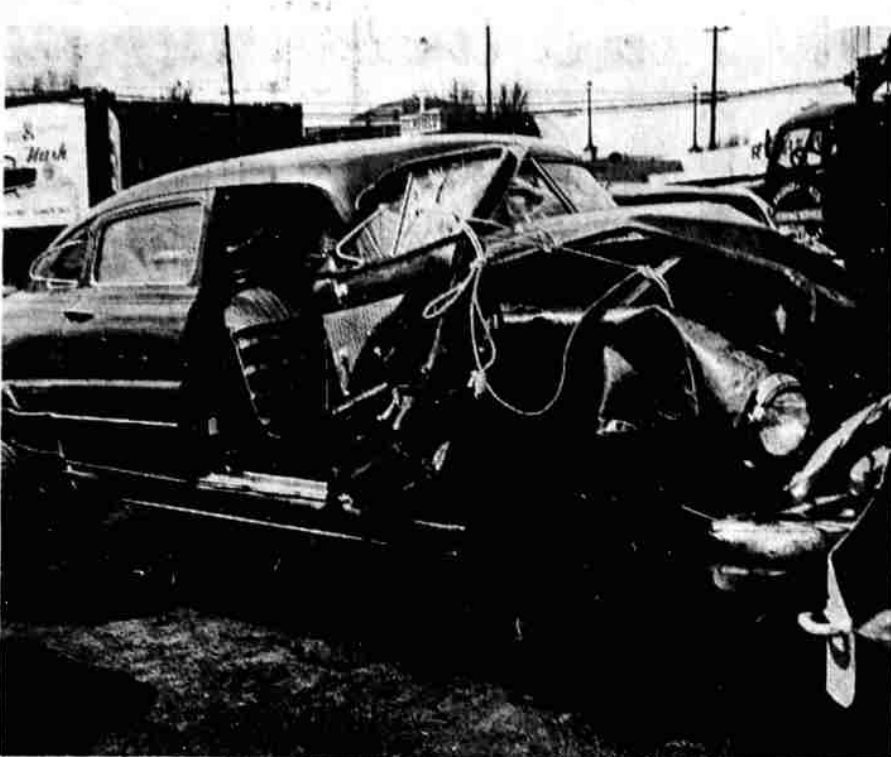

Ground Water Brings Tears

ROLL, Ariz. (AP)—Settlers wept with joy Thursday as the first ground-level water poured onto their sun-dried lands.

For the first time in the 50-year history of reclamation waters of the Colorado arrived to point a tremendous future development of the 75,000-acre Wellton-Mohawk district.

Ranchers and their families—about 4,500 in all—turned out for the festivities at this tiny community 35 miles north of Yuma.

Using a gold-plated shovel, Reclamation Commissioner Michael W. Straus turned dirt sending water onto the land.

Earlier Thursday Colorado River water was diverted into the 50-mile main canal at Imperial Dam.

The entire 75,000-acre project will be in cultivation in three years, Straus said.

Washington Aids CARE Activity

SEATTLE (AP)—Washington state residents contributed \$1,237,655.12 for CARE packages of food and other supplies to be sent overseas the past six years, Northwest Director Richard Trudeau reported Thursday.

Oregon and Idaho's respective amounts were \$755,399.04 and \$200,832.78.

Nationally, 11,000,000 CARE packages were sent during the six years to needy people in Europe, the Near East and Asia.
