Catholic Church Growth Sixty-fold in 48 Years

History of Klamath Falls first Catholic church goes back to purchase of property in 1904 by Bishop O'Reilly. Fairview school now stands on that lot.
The first church building was started in 1905 with donated and hired labor, and the frame building was blessed on All Saints Day, Nov. 1, the same year.
Prior to establishment of the church, Catholic missionaries came here from Jacksonville only three times a year, traveling either on horseback or by horse and buggy.
When the first church was built there were not more than 10 Catholic families in the area. Now the congregation has grown to 600 families of 2400 persons.
At first Sacred Heart parish, covered the whole county. But now there are separate parish churches in Chiloquin and Merrill with a new church under construction at Bonanza.
