Famed Ball Scout Dies

MONROVIA, Calif. (AP) — Baseball has lost a scout credited with sending a host of star players to the Boston Red Sox.

Ernie Johnson, 64, of Santa Ana, succumbed at Monrovia Sanitarium Thursday. He had suffered from bronchial asthma.

A former player in the Major and manager in the Pacific Coast League, Johnson had been a Red Sox scout for several years. He sent such greats as Ted Williams, Dom DiMaggio, Johnny Pesky and Bobby Doerr to the American League club.

Johnson was called up from Salt Lake City to play shortstop in the White Sox infield that had been shattered by the Black Sox scandal.

He was with the Sox in 1921-22, the Yankees the next three years and then came to the Pacific Coast. He managed Portland through 1928, then went with Seattle and later joined the Boston scouting system.

Hill Gail Top Pick In Kentucky Derby Classic

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Seventeen three-year old colts were named Friday for the 78th Kentucky Derby to be run over the mile and one-quarter at Churchill Downs Saturday.

When the name of Mrs. Marion Dupont Scott's Pindrop was dropped into the entry box shortly before closing time the list was believed to be complete.

There was only one surprise among the entries, 10 of which were received Thursday.

Ben Jones entered Calumet Farm's Top Blend as a running mate for the 7 to 5 favorite, Hill Gail. Top Blend won a six-furlong sprint at the Downs Monday in 1:11 4/5.

Hill Gail's name was the second in the entry box Friday, arriving shortly after Eddie Rice, agent for Jockey Gerald Porch, made C. V. Whitney's well-liked Cold Command a definite starter.

Then within the next two and one-half hours followed Mrs. Gordon Guberson's California-owned Arrow, Eddie Burke's Swoop, an outsider from New York, Top Blend; M. A. White's Eternal Moon, also a rank outsider and finally Pindrop.

Missing as expected, was Gift Silver — the little Iowa-owned and bred colt which had created much pre-Derby stir.

Gift Silver which never had raced and never worked more than five-eighths of a mile, was withdrawn when a veterinarian decided the colt on his right foreleg had not healed sufficiently.
