OPS Has 491 Men in N.W.

SEATTLE (AP)—The regional Office of Price Stabilization said Friday it has 491 employees in Washington, Oregon and Idaho receiving salaries totaling \$2,452,565 a year.

Joseph S. Miller, regional OPS information officer, said this information was released at request of U. S. senators and newspapers in the region.

He said five men in the region are receiving \$10,000 annually. A breakdown shows 313 employees in Washington state, receiving \$1,569,270. There are 110 in Oregon receiving \$545,120 a year and 68 in Idaho receiving \$338,165.

PORTLAND (AP)—Police Chief Donald J. McNamara said Friday he would assign a 24-hour patrol to watch picketing at the main Western Union office here to prevent a recurrence of "incidents."

He said Sam H. Walker, a company technician, reported he was attacked by four men as he left the building Thursday. He said his glasses were broken. A woman employee and a woman picket engaged in a brief exchange Friday morning, he said.

Another woman, employed in a building adjoining the Western Union, said she received a telephone threat and asked for police protection. She got it.

Previously police have been stationed at the office only during a change of pickets.

Still here is Gov. Val Peterson of Nebraska. He was at Eugene Friday for a mock Republican presidential convention at the University of Oregon.

Gov. Adlai Stevenson of Illinois left for California Friday after speaking at a Democratic banquet.

Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge (R-Mass.), manager of Gen. Eisenhower's campaign for the Republican presidential nomination, is expected in Portland Sunday night. He will address a rally at the Portland Ice Arena Monday night.

Monday Gov. Earl Warren of California, another Republican presidential candidate, is due in Oregon.

Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) will arrive Tuesday to campaign in his race for the Republican national convention.

Also due Tuesday is Harold Stassen, former Minnesota governor, who is campaigning for the GOP presidential nomination.

Sen. Estes Kefauver of Tennessee, a candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination, is expected May 11.



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Clark Promises Full Effort

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gen. Mark Clark said after a conference with President Truman Friday that he will do everything in his power to bring about "an honorable armistice" in Korea.

Clark, who has been named to succeed Gen. Matthew Ridgway as commander in the Far East, said he thought he had a "difficult task" ahead. But it would not be his first tough job.

Clark told reporters he conferred with the President on problems in Korea and also held a White House talk with Secretary of State Acheson later.

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
