Weyerhaeuser Chairman Dies

ST. PAUL — Harry T. Kendall, 63, chairman of the board of the Weyerhaeuser Sales Co., St. Paul, died Friday of a heart attack at White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., business associates were informed.

Kendall and his wife were attending a meeting of the United States Chamber of Commerce, of which he was a director. He had joined the Weyerhaeuser Lumber Company in 1932.

At his death, Kendall was a consultant to the Federal Munitions Board and chairman of the Lumber Manufacturing division of the National Industry Advisory Council.

Survivors include his widow, three sons and a daughter.

Another 'No' By Stevenson

SACRAMENTO — Governor Adlai Stevenson of Illinois dropped in Friday night from Oregon, still saying no to suggestions he might be drafted to be a Democratic presidential candidate.

In Portland, he said: "I spent the greatest part of the evening trying to persuade them not to vote for me."

His name was entered in the Oregon primary and it can't be taken off.

Stevenson, who was to visit Saturday with Governor Warren, a Republican presidential candidate, also said he is not in California for political purposes.

Upon being advised that Oregon Democratic National Committee man Monroe Sweetland had said he believed "the door is open to a draft," Stevenson said in an interview: "That Mr. Sweetland's observation, I tried to impress him otherwise."

Asked how he feels about being asked about the presidency everywhere he stops, Stevenson said: "Frankly, it gets a little tiresome. I haven't been able to devise any new amusing answers."

Norblad Favored to Get First District Nod Again

SALEM — Since Rep. Walter Norblad, the young Astoria lawyer, went to Congress six years ago, he hasn't had any trouble winning reelection. This time, he has two opponents in the Republican primary, but neither is well known in the First District (Northwest Oregon).

The two opponents are State Rep. Earl E. Fisher, the Beaverton horse-raising grower, defeated in the last Legislature in his fight against colored oleomargarine, and Kenneth E. Brown, a Gervais farmer who is taking up his late father's political career.

Where Fisher stands on national issues is unknown. He refuses to grant interviews saying he is too busy to talk to reporters. In an answer to a letter asking his views, Fisher said "read the voters pamphlet."

MANY IDEAS

In the Voter's Pamphlet, Fisher says he wants restoration of constitutional government, a four-lane highway from Oregon City to Salem, better schools, more post-office buildings, a salmon hatchery on every river, statehood for Alaska and Hawaii, more shipbuilding for Oregon, old-age pensions, lower taxes, and honesty in government.

Fisher has been in the legislature for 16 years.

Norblad's other opponent, Brown, got into politics through his father, Sam Brown, the famed office seeker of the 30's, whose slogan was "40 and a Ford." His father's last attempt was in 1938 when he ran for governor, but Charles A. Sprague, Salem publisher, won the Republican nomination and then won in November, too.

Brown is bitterly anti-war. He ran in 1940 on the same platform for the same office, but lost to the late Rep. James W. Moll, 10,895 to 65,358.

Brown, who farms the original 100-year-old domain land claim of his grandfather, blames the Jews for the world's troubles. The Jews, he says, sponsor world Communism, and run the United States.

"Within our own country the Jewish minority wields such tremendous financial, political and propaganda power as to constitute an invisible government," Brown says.

However, Brown says he has no antagonism toward the Jewish people.

TRUMAN

He opposes President Truman's seizure of the steel industry, fearing it could lead to the government's taking over of all industry.

Brown operates a big Gilbert orchard, but now is digging up many of his trees. He says the Gilbert price has dropped from 20 cents a pound to 10 cents because President Truman allows foreign tubers to be imported.

He opposes all foreign aid, and says the United Nations aids Communism and violates American sovereignty. Brown opposes Universal Military Training, and wants to call all American troops home from abroad.

Norblad won't be able to get home to campaign but that doesn't worry him.

Robert B. Jones, County Commissioner of Clackamas County, is unopposed for the Democratic nomination for Norblad's job. He argues that Oregon's Republican delegation in Congress isn't getting Oregon its share of federal tax money. Jones describes himself as a Roosevelt Democrat.
