Wenatchee Climbs On 4 Straight Wins

The word is going around the Western International League the Wenatchee Chiefs will bear watching.

League tallies only Friday, the Chiefs suddenly found their punch over the weekend, put together four straight victories and bounded into a fourth-place tie with Vancouver, 3 1/2 games behind Victoria's pace-setting Tyes.

Victoria meanwhile stayed out in front by downing Yakima's Bears 11-3 and 8-2 in a Saturday double header.

Vancouver and the same Bears were Wenatchee's weekend victims. They clipped the Bears 11-3 and 3-2 Sunday, after 2-1 and 5-1 wins over Vancouver, regarded as a league powerhouse, Friday and Saturday.

Elsewhere around the league, Spokane played in second place and made up for a 5-4 Saturday night loss to Salem by downing the Senators 2-0 and 4-2 in a Sunday doubleheader. Lewiston's Braves, whipped 18-1 by Tri-City Saturday night, took over third place in the standings Sunday with 15-3 and 4-3 triumphs over the Braves.

Victoria and Vancouver, idled by Canada's no Sunday baseball law, opened an all-Canadian series at Vancouver in the league's only scheduled game Monday.

Wenatchee showed its new power against Yakima on the Bears home lot Sunday and against Vancouver in the Caps own ballpark Saturday.

In the opener at Yakima, the Chiefs chased in eight runs before the Bears could put one man across the plate. Singles by Ross McCormick and player-manager Dick Adams and a double by Bud Hjelmma scored two runs in the first inning.

Bill Cleveland's double brought in three more in the third and the Chiefs scored again in the fifth, sixth and the wild seventh when three runs came in on two hits, three walks and a hit batsman. A three-run rally in the seventh inning of the nightcap gave the Chiefs their fourth straight victory.

Both Lewiston and Tri-City managers doubled as pitchers in Sunday's doubleheader at Kennewick. Lewiston Pilot Bill Brenner held the Braves to five hits in the seven-inning nightcap. In the wild opener, Tri-City Manager Charlie Gassaway was one of four Tri-City hurlers touched for the 16 hits credited to the Braves. Milt Smith led the Lewiston attack with two doubles and two singles in five trips in that game.

Tight pitching by Frank Chase and Bob Roberts put Spokane in the win column at Salem. Chase struck out six and yielded only two safeties in the opener, and Roberts gave up four hits in the afterpiece.

Col Bonney's team blanked Peoria 7-0. Jim Palmer's team shut out Fremont, 4-0.

In other games, Fairview beat Roosevelt, 4-2, and Riverside outslugged Concord, 17-6.

The Palmermen won the Class B title with the Bonneymen finishing second. Second-round games of the Class A tourney show this afternoon.
