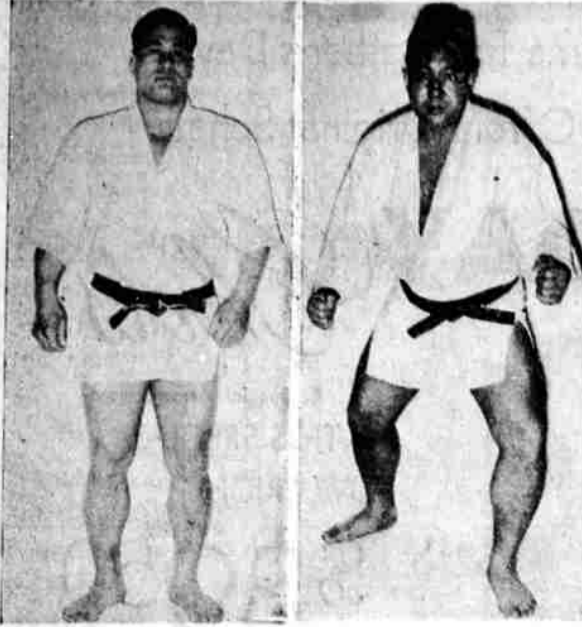


Judo Stars Appear Here

Judo Stars Highlight Mat Card Tomorrow

The world's judo champion and runner-up, who drew crowds of 10,000 and 8,000 in Los Angeles and San Francisco, appear tomorrow night at the Klamath Falls Armory in the special event on an outstanding three-hour mat card.

The champion judo expert is Masa Kimura, who has never been beaten in 14 years of judo wrestling.

He shows his skill against Shibusya Yamanchi, just a notch below Kimura in skill.

Kimura, 35, and 205 pounds, has made a standing offer of \$1000 to anyone who can beat him in a judo match.

More than 20 tried, and failed, in California. The offer still stands. The Japanese pair will remain in the Northwest circuit for just a few more weeks, then head east on their proposed world tour.

The half-hour judo match shows between two one-hour, catch-as-catch-can bouts.

In one, Pacific Coast Junior Heavyweight Champion, Frankie Stojack clashes with Kurt Von Poppenheim, the sadistic German. Georges Dusette and Buck Weaver tangle in the other bout.

Both clashes are billed for one hour, or the best two of three falls, in deference to the champions.

Weaver holds the Pacific Coast light-heavyweight title. Reserved tickets are on sale at Castleberry Drugs.

Mustangs Win County Trackfest

Reeves Equals 100 Mark

The hard-running Malin Mustangs edged out stubborn Henley and blue ribbon-grabbing Merrill to cop the Klamath County "B" track and field championship at Modoc Field yesterday.

Malin chalked up 64 points, Henley 55 and Merrill 33.

Not until the last three events were recorded was Malin sure of a victory. At one point the Mustangs led the Hornets by only one point late in the match . . . 49 to 48.

RECORD
Flashy Dick Reeves of Merrill romped through the 100 and 220 yard sprints in good fashion, tying a county record with a 10.3 clocking in the century. He won the 220 in 24.2 seconds, one of the two double winners of the day.

Bob Micka, Malin—a lad who finishes the distance races as though they were sprints—came from behind in the stretch both times to win the half mile and mile events. Both times he won going away.

DISQUALIFIED
Malin lost the 180 yard low hurdles through disqualification when big Wayne Rick stepped out of his lane early in the run. Though he crossed the tape first, Will Harnsberger, Henley, was awarded the win. Only two other runners managed to finish the race.

A crowd of about 250 watched the meet.

Cleveland's Finish Hinges On Durability of Big Four

Can Cleveland's vaunted Big Four, rated the most formidable pitching staff in baseball, continue its iron man role?

Will Bob Feller, Bob Lemon, Early Wynn and Mike Garcia, doing double duty, be able to finish strong, pitching at this work-horse pace?

Time will tell, of course, but based on last year's results, the answer is "No."

A year ago, the big four carried the light-hitting Indians all the way until mid-September. Starting and relieving, it finally broke down under the stretch run burden despite the 20 or more victories racked up by Feller, Wynn and Garcia.

The same four are working at a more killing pace this season. In Cleveland's 19 games, Feller, Lemon, Wynn and Garcia have started all but one. They've also been used in relief four times.

Al Lopez had to use Wynn in relief for Lemon Monday and the move paid off as the Indians came

from behind to defeat the Boston Red Sox, 4-2, in 10 innings. Wynn, who started and was knocked out Sunday, yielded one run in three innings and was credited with his fourth victory against one defeat.

CLIMB
The victory boosted the second-place Indians to within one game of the American League-leading Red Sox.

Righthander Frank Shea and Outfielder Archie Wilson, obtained via trade from the New York Yankees Saturday, learned up to give the Washington Senators a 13-1 victory over the skidding St. Louis Browns in the only night activity in the Major Leagues.

KEEP LEAD
New York's Giants maintained their slim half-game margin over the Brooklyn Dodgers in the National League, making use of their four hits to nip the Chicago Cubs, 3-2. West's Westrum's run-scoring triple, plus the brilliant relief pitching of Monte Kennedy, earned the Giants their seventh straight victory.

Ralph Branca limited Pittsburgh to four hits as Andy Patko and Gil Hodges paced the Dodgers to a 5-1 victory with home runs. The game was halted at the end of eight innings by rain.

Kentucky Under Eye Of Athletic Fathers

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The inquiring eye of the National Collegiate Athletic Association was cast Tuesday toward the University of Kentucky, whose athletic program has been described by a New York judge as a commercial enterprise.

The school itself asked for a full investigation. Judge Saul Street prompted the inquiry when he dealt suspended sentences to three former Kentucky cage stars. The three — placed on indefinite probation — were Alex Groza, Ralph Beard and Dale Barnstable.

Judge Street said, "The University and the basketball coach (Adolph Rupp) must share the responsibility with the fixers for corrupting and demoralizing these defendants."

President H. L. Donovan of the University said the school hoped to reply late Tuesday to the judge's charges. He also sent telegrams to the NCAA, the Southeastern Conference and the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools asking for a full investigation.

Jackie Leads

NEW YORK (AP)—Brooklyn's Jackie Robinson, shooting for his second National League batting crown, Tuesday held a fat 142-point lead over Stan Musial — the best who usually winds up on top at the end of the season.

While Musial, the St. Louis Cardinal slugger, is in a 277 "slump," Robinson tops both Major Leagues in hitting with a .426 average.

No such pattern in the American League, where Bob Neuman and Jim Delsing of the St. Louis Browns are tied for the lead. Each has a .400 mark. Figures include Monday's games.
