Allied Planes Hit Red City in Day-Long Raid

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—Hundreds of Allied warplanes bombed Suncheon, a North Korean rail junction, in a day-long raid Tuesday.

"There'll really be a major revision of Red rail schedules tonight," a Fifth Air Force spokesman said.

The full strength of four fighter-bomber wings joined in the attack. Sabre jets guarded the area while the fighter-bombers roared out in repeated attacks on the vital railway link 25 miles north of the North Korean capital, Pyongyang.

Monday night a formation of 100 fighters from Okinawa, using electronic bombing techniques, rained 80 tons of big explosives on a rail bridge at Hulchon. It was their second attack on the repeatedly repaired bridge in three days.

The double concentration on key sectors of a single vital rail line is a new technique to nullify the speed with which Communists repair bombed out roadbeds.

The concentrated attack on heavily defended Suncheon was preceded by round-the-clock raids on the major Communist railroad linking Suncheon with the Manchurian border.

From Suncheon the rail lines fork to supply either end of the 155-mile front lines.

Fighter-bombers concentrated Monday on a 40-mile stretch of track between Kunu and Hulchon. Pilots reported they tore up rails in 80 spots. Kunu is a junction point 20 miles north of Suncheon. Hulchon is 60 air miles south of the Manchurian border.

The Navy reported pilots from the carriers Valley Forge and Princeton sent out Monday to "destroy laboriously reconstructed enemy repair gangs to reconstruct."

Carrier pilots also swept the eastern end of the battle line. The Navy said they killed 400 Communist troops.

The toughest spot on the Western front erupted again Tuesday when 40 Reds attacked an Allied position northwest of Yonchon at 1 a.m.

The U.N. troops withdrew from their much fought over outpost. But later they reoccupied it without firing a shot after it was blasted by Allied artillery.
