



Suds Beat, Injured By Bevos

The Portland Beavers paid their first visit of the 1952 Pacific Coast League baseball season to the Seattle Rainiers Stadium Tuesday night — and were anything but the perfect guests.

The Beavers not only trounced the Rainiers 8-2, they sent Manager Bill Sweeney to the hospital, and placed two other Rainiers on the injured list.

Sweeney, struck on the right forearm by Don Egger's line drive into the Seattle dugout in the first inning, was taken to a hospital for observation. But that was only the beginning of the Rainiers' woes.

In the sixth, First Baseman George Vico hurt his left arm trying to tag Beaver Pitcher Red Adams at first. And in the seventh, Shortstop Artie Wilson sprained an ankle attempting a double steal with Pete Pavlick.

Steve Nagy and Adams hooked up in a pitcher's duel for the first seven innings which ended with the score tied 2-2. Then the Beavers staged a mighty six-run splash, sparked by Egger's grand slam homer.

Hollywood bombarded three Real hurlers for 14 rallies.

Three runs in the first two innings, including a homer by Ed Lavigne, gave Los Angeles a 3-2 win over Oakland. The Oaks made their points in the ninth on a walk, a triple by Lloyd Christopher, an error and flyout.

At San Diego, the Sacramento Solons pounded two pitchers for 12 hits and a 7-2 victory.

PORTLAND (AP) — Bob Duden of Portland led the field into the third round of the Oregon Open golf tournament Wednesday, but was crowded closely by Ray Honsberger, Clarkston, Wash., pro, and two others.

Honsberger forged into second place in Tuesday's round by firing seven consecutive birdies, a new Pacific Northwest record.

He shot one under par from the fifth through the 11th holes for a 66 on the par 72 course and a two-day total of 129, one stroke behind Duden, who fired a 71 Tuesday.

Chuck Congdon and Frank Newell, both of Tacoma, tied Honsberger at 139.
