Dusette won the first fall over Weaver but the ex-Indiana football star scored with the stomping toe hold for the last two.

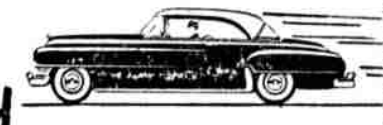
