Culinary experts tell us that the chicken has departed further from its original jungle existence than almost any other bird. The chicken which once ran wild is now carefully cultivated and the result is proportion of tender white meat.

CHICKEN PIE PALMER HOUSE:

- 3 cups cooked chicken
- 1 cup cooked carrots
- 12 cooked onions
- 12 cooked potato balls
- 1/2 cup button mushrooms
- 4 tablespoons shortening or chicken fat
- tablespoons flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- dash pepper
- 1 1/2 cups chicken stock
- 1 cup thin cream or milk
- 2 tablespoons melted butter or margarine
- 3 cups corn flakes

Arrange pieces of chicken which have been removed from bone, carrots, onion, potato balls and mushrooms in six individual casseroles.

Melt shortening add flour and seasonings; add chicken stock and cream slowly, stirring constantly. Cook over low heat, stirring frequently until thickened. Pour over chicken and vegetables. Sprinkle melted butter over corn flakes and stir until each flake is buttered. Cover tops of casseroles with corn flakes. Bake in preheated very hot oven (500 F.) 10 to 15 minutes. Yield: 6 individual casseroles.

Mine Safety Power Voted

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted Wednesday to give the federal government power to enforce safety measures in the nation's coal mines.

A voice vote passed the legislation and sent it to the House. At present, enforcement of mine safety is left to the states.

Federal inspectors can only make recommendations. The Senate bill would permit the Secretary of Interior to fix safety standards.

Federal inspectors could close down a mine if they found a condition of imminent danger. Sen. Neely (D-W. Va.) sponsored the bill. A federal law has long been sought by John L. Lewis, head of the Coal Miners Union.

Truman's Reclamation Policy Faces New Tilt

WASHINGTON (AP) — The President's "no new starts" policy for reclamation projects faced a new attack Wednesday.

Officials and water users from Washington, Montana and North Dakota scheduled appearances before a Senate Appropriations subcommittee to urge that new projects be put under way.

The new projects to be specifically pushed are the Kennewick division of the Yakima project in Washington; and two Missouri Basin project units, the lower Marias, below Fort Peck in Montana, and the diversion dam of the Missouri-Souris unit which lies in both Montana and North Dakota.

Sen. Murray (D-Mont.) in a statement prepared for the subcommittee said the "no new starts" policy, "in effect for more than two years, should now be modified."

Under the policy, the President has in general refused to request funds for any new project not related to the defense effort.

Despite defense demands, Murray said, "we believe that we should proceed with land and water resource development under a sound program and with minimum appropriations of one billion dollars annually during the defense period, which amount should be increased as soon as conditions permit."

An attempt to break the line on the "no new starts" policy failed last year.

Funds to begin eight new reclamation projects were approved by the Senate Appropriations Committee, but were cut out of the Interior Department money bill on the Senate floor.

The Interior bill as it passed the House this year failed to include funds to begin any new projects. Witnesses expected to testify Wednesday included Sen. Magnuson (D-Wash.) and Jay Perry, president of the Kennewick Irrigation Development, Kennewick, Wash.

Rainfall Helps, Frost Hurts

PORTLAND (AP) — Rains helped Western Oregon crops the past week, but frosts caused damage over much of the state, the weekly crop-weather report said Wednesday.

Damage to fruit was worst in the Hood River Valley and at The Dalles. This included pear, apple and cherry crops. The first bloom on Western Oregon strawberries also was destroyed. In the Willamette Valley, damage was spotted.

Although rain retarded spring farm work it helped pastures and early crops. Moisture conditions have returned to about normal for this time of year in Western Oregon, the report said. Rain is still needed in Eastern Oregon.

The condition of livestock is behind normal in Eastern Oregon because of the long winter.
