WSB Chieftain Defends Post

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman Nathan P. Feinsinger defended Thursday the unanimous voting record of public members of the Wage Stabilization Board (WSB). He said it helped get firm settlement of labor-management wage disputes.

"I don't understand this criticism of any of the three board groups — public, labor and industry — for voting unanimously," he said.

Feinsinger was under fire before a House Labor Committee investigating the board, with special emphasis on the WSB's ruling in the steel case. It was his second day in defense of the board's action.

Committee Counsel John Forsyth told Feinsinger many persons were disturbed over the "success (of the six public members) in always reaching a common conclusion," and then asked:

"Is there any reason why the public members always take the side of one of the other (labor or industry) groups?"

No reason "except to get a majority vote," Feinsinger replied.

"I doubt," Forsyth commented, "that you'll find any court of more than one judge which has sat as long as you have and never had disagreements."

Three-Way Team Boosts Navy

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Truman Plans 10 Years Of Doing as He Likes

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman said Thursday that after he leaves the White House next January, he plans to spend ten years having a good time and doing just as he damn pleases.

He discussed his future with reporters at the weekly White House news conference which coincided

with his 68th birthday and the seventh anniversary of Germany's World War II collapse.

Truman said he would like to travel to some parts of the world he hasn't seen, but he will go nowhere and do nothing that might embarrass the next president.

That was in reply to a question as to whether he would travel abroad when he leaves office and perhaps visit Generalissimo Stalin.

GOOD HUMOR

Truman was in good humor in talking of his personal plans, but solemn on world conditions.

He said conditions are very grave. Then he added a prediction there will be no World War III. Labor-management disputes do not cut American production and if Congress restores the reductions that have been made in his defense and foreign aid budgets.

The recent production losses and the congressional move to trim military and foreign aid spending, the President declared, are right

down Stalin's alley.

Truman said also:

1—He has no present intention of announcing his choice among the various candidates for the Democratic presidential nomination. But he added he has the right to do so when and if he chooses — and he said the 1948 election shows he's a good judge on political matters.

2—He hopes for an early settlement of the oil strike and is not considering use of the Taft-Hartley act at this stage. He declined comment on the steel dispute while it is before the Supreme Court.

3—There was no politics in the Federal Reserve Board's relaxation of credit controls Wednesday. The board uses its control powers, he said, to meet threats of inflation and deflation alike. He added he hopes Congress won't get the idea these control powers are no longer needed.

4—He's confident the Democratic platform to be adopted at Chicago will support a compulsory Fair Employment Practices Commission (FEPC). He said he hasn't budgeted a bit from his support of that plank in the 1948 platform of both Democratic and Republican parties.

THOUGHTS

Ernest H. Vaccaro of the Associated Press asked him if he had any thoughts to express in connection with this anniversary of his 1945 announcement that German resistance had collapsed.

Soberly, the President replied that since that date this country has devoted all its efforts to maintaining a lasting world peace.

To date, through the years of the cold war and Korea, we have been successful, he added.

But, said the President, conditions at the present time are very grave.

Jap Students Hurt In Riot

TOKYO, Friday, May 9 (AP) — The Kyodo News Agency reported that 35 students were injured, nine of them seriously, in a brush with police early today on the University grounds.

Two faculty members were reported slightly hurt, while a Kyodo reporter who got caught in the melee, was beaten and got a gashed scalp.

The agency said the incident, involving about 1,000 students, stemmed back to the bloody Communist-led May Day riot in the Imperial Plaza.

Two Japanese plain clothesmen went to the university Thursday afternoon to serve warrants on several students in connection with the riot.

Kyodo said the students captured the two policemen and held them incommunicado.

Police reinforcements arrived, but failed to talk the students into releasing the plain clothesmen.

Early today the police finally received orders from higher up to use force, and charged into the crowd of students.

The Kyodo reporter said the students did not use violence to resist, but he did not say whether the captive officers were freed.
