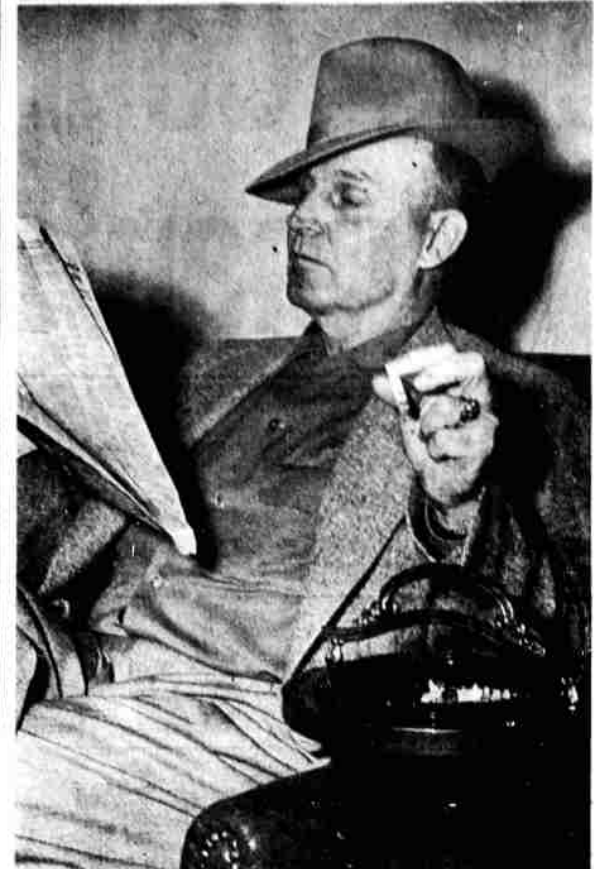
WSC Winning in Rodeo

Snake Wins Out Over Big Muddy In Boaters' Opinion

LEWISTON, Idaho (AP)—The Snake River has it all over the Mississippi, says Roy Safley of Los Angeles. You can get a drink or a bath out of the Snake, but the Father of Waters is as muddy as it is long.

Safley, a slight, shy man in his fifties, dropped into Lewiston by bus and left late Friday by rubber life boat, headed for Portland.

Not because there aren't other ways to leave. He just likes to travel by rubber boat.

Safley has made seven trips in the last five years on the Snake, Mississippi and Missouri.

This time he will head for the Columbia River and go all the way to Portland if he can hitch a ride on a tug through the canal at Bonneville Dam.

It all started when he saw a surplus air force rescue boat in a Los Angeles store window. Safley bought it—the realization of a long standing dream—and went to Great Falls, Mont., where he tossed the boat in the Missouri River and shoved off. It was the first time he'd ever sailed in anything larger than a rowboat.

"It was damn awkward for a couple of hours," Safley commented.

Last year he followed Mark Twain's old route down the Mississippi to Natchez. Before that he'd tried the Snake three times.

A bachelor, Safley says he never takes passengers.

The Californian spends three months of the year with his boat.

The rest of the time he works for a moving company.
