## Four Jailed, One Injured

Klamath Avenue, in the vicinity of 27th St., resembled a battlefield Saturday and Sunday. City Police reported.

Two separate fights sent four men to the city jail and one of them to Klamath Valley Hospital Saturday afternoon for treatment of head cuts.

James Kenneth Morris, route 2, box 795, was arrested for disorderly conduct after hospital treatment and is free under \$100 bail.

Officers reported Saturday afternoon Morris came into a tavern, picked up a beer bottle from a table and hit Chester Jarozewski, 21 Anchor Hotel, over the head. Jarozewski took after Morris, running out the front door, caught up with him on the sidewalk and floored him with one punch which Morris told police.

Jarozewski was arrested for disorderly conduct.

Saturday night two men were arrested after a fight at 7th and Klamath. Walter Jazwak, 524 Main St., was charged with disorderly conduct and Tony Drubilo, 519 extra gang 12, was picked up on charges of drunk and disorderly conduct. Officers said the two became involved in a brawl after exchanging a few heated words.

Police stated a total of 32 persons were arrested over the weekend for intoxication and other charges.

## U.N. Planes Blast Rails

SEUL, Korea (AP)—United Nations warplanes Monday blasted the North Korean rail network with another of their new saturation bombings designed to make track repairs as tough as possible for the Reds.

The U.S. Fifth Air Force said fighter-bombers made 28 cuts in a short stretch on the vital Kanggye-Sinanju line near Huihchon in the northwest.

Nine U.S. B29s hit the Huihchon rail bridge Sunday with 90 tons of bombs.

Fighter-bombers cratered 99 in more than 80 places on a small section south of Huihchon at the same time.

The stretches of track are on main rail routes from Manchuria to the North Korean capital, Pyongyang.

In the past two weeks, U.N. warplanes have been concentrating the bombings in short sections on the main lines.

This makes repair work more difficult for the Red track crews, who have been able overnight to repair cuts by only a few tons of bombs.

U.S. Marine Corsairs and Frontier jets attacked Communist front lines Monday.

The Air Force said they wrecked 16 bunkers and destroyed eight gun positions with explosives.

U.N. warships bombarded Red supply areas, gun and troop positions on both coasts of North Korea Sunday.

South Korean police said two of their men and one Communist guerrilla were killed Friday night when about 50 guerrillas attacked the town of Hamyang, 45 miles west of Pusan deep in South Korea.

## U.S. Destroyer Hit, 2 Killed

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Navy announced Monday that two men were killed outright and six wounded, one of them fatally, when the destroyer James C. Owens was hit by six Communist shells off the Northeast Coast of Korea May 7.

The destroyer suffered some structural damage from shrapnel and a depth charge carried by the vessel was exploded by a direct hit from enemy guns on the shore near Songjin.
