Senators Vote to Curb, Reorganize Wage Board

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Banking Committee has voted to strip the Wage Stabilization Board (WSB) of its controversial powers in labor disputes and to reorganize it as an all-public body.

As now set up, the board consists of six members, each representing organized labor, industry and the public.

At the same time the committee voted late Tuesday to continue wage and price controls until next March 1.

Two Democratic senators said Wednesday the control extends to a watered-down bill which would weaken the fight against inflation.

Sen. Douglas of Illinois and Moody of Michigan said the committee "did not adopt a single strengthening amendment favoring the consuming public."

The current controls law expires June 30. The 7 to 3 vote to reorganize the wage board was an outgrowth of bitter criticism of the board's handling of the steel dispute. Protesters have been voiced in Congress over the amount of pay raises the WSB recommended for the CIO Steelworkers and for its enforcement of a union shop in the industry.

Under a union shop agreement, a non-union worker may be hired but he must join a union within a specified time.

The reorganization proposal, presented by Sen. Dicksen (R-Ill.), does not say how many members the board should have. Their appointment would be subject to Senate confirmation. Present board appointments are not.

The new board would report directly to the Director of Economic Stabilization.

Charles E. Wilson, who resigned as director mobilizer in a row over administration handling of the steel dispute, had complained he was bypassed by the WSB, which sometimes went directly to the President.

The new board could formulate and recommend to the economic stabilizer general policies and rules on wages.

The committee instructed its staff to draw up an amendment to specify that the Caperhart amendment to the controls law applies only to manufacturers and not to retailers.

The Caperhart provision says price ceilings must allow for increased costs from the start of the Korean war to last July 26.

The proposed amendment to the Caperhart section was requested by the Office of Price Stabilization.

Carpenters Quit In California

SAF FRANCISCO (AP) — The Associated General Contractors Tuesday ordered immediate suspension throughout 42 North and Central California Counties of all jobs where there is carpentry work.

Triggered by AGC's 42-county Negotiating Committee, carried out a threat voiced after the AFL carpenters backing up demands for hikes and a welfare plan, backwaking off jobs valued in the billions of dollars.

The AGC's decision extended a work stoppage already effective in four California counties where an AFL carpenter strike has been on for 10 months.

Quoted action must be taken to feel our bargaining unit," the negotiating Committee announcement stated.

The union demand for the 42-county increase of 15 cents an hour plus six cents more to erase differential between their area and that for Bay Area carpenters. Bay Area union locals have demanded a 15-cent hike. All the jobs are demanding a health and welfare fund.
