

Malin Faces Cascade Locks State Spikefest Opens Tomorrow

Locals In State Run

Thirteen boys and a relay team will represent the Klamath Basin tomorrow and Saturday when the state's top Class A and B athletes meet in the Oregon high school track and field meet at the Oregon State campus.

The Klamath Falls Pelicans send two boys into the Class A meet. They are Miller Rod Klus and Harold Simmers, second-place finishers in their events last Saturday in the Southern Oregon district meet.

Malin, Henley and Merrill compete in the Class B division, to be run in conjunction with the Class A cinderfest.

Malin qualified six in the District 2 qualifying tests last Saturday. Winning at Medford were Andy Travis, mile; Stuart Hensel, 440; Dale Fenters, pole vault; and Bob Micka, 880. Rod Lyons finished second in the pole vault, and Dick Reeves of Merrill will be the busiest local athlete in the state meet.

Reeves will run in the 220-yard sprint, an event he won at Medford; the 100-yard dash, where he finished second; and on the Husky relay team that ran second in the qualifying meet. Jerry Wolfman is the other Merrill entry, with a second-place in the low hurdles.

Ellis P. Hagler, head golf coach at Duke, is a former Alabama football star and has been Blue Devil line coach since 1931.

CORVALLIS (Special)—Upwards of 400 of the best prep trackmen in Oregon—Class A and B—converge on the Oregon State College campus tomorrow and Saturday for the 26th annual state high school track and field meet.

Qualifying for the cinder classic was completed in district meets last weekend. Athletes who finished first or second in district tests and those who ran on the first and second place relay teams are eligible for the state meet.

The lone exception to this rule is Portland's District 9, which qualified the first three in each individual event and four relay teams.

Preliminaries in all events except the 880, mile, high jump and pole vault will be held tomorrow, with finals slated Saturday. Results of the District 3 meet last Saturday upset the dope sheets of the spike prophets when Grants Pass upset Medford, defending state champion.

The Black Tornado of Medford, with four straight state titles tucked in its trophy room, will probably go into the meet underdog to the Cavemen, although with point-splitting expected to rival a political convention, anything can happen.

Older record for the current crop to shoot at is the all-time 880 mark of 1:56.8, set by Vere Wind-nagle of Washington (Portland) in 1912. The modern record for the half-mile run was established by Al Martin of Cottage Grove in 1950—a 1:39.9 effort.

Another mark that has withstood all challenges for many years is in the 100-yard dash. Bobby Grayson of Portland's Jefferson High clipped the century in .09.9 in 1922. The modern record for the title last year. The "B"s joined the "A"s in the state meet in 1947.

Klamath 3rd In AAU Meet

Klamath Falls picked up 16 1/2 points—good enough for third place—in the Southern Oregon Junior AAU track and field meet in Medford last night, a trackfest designed for high school youngsters 16 and under.

Grants Pass won with 92 1/2. Medford scored 84, followed by Klamath Falls, Ashland with 7 1/2. Eagle Point with 4 and Phoenix with 3.

Doyle Watson picked up a second in the pole vault. Dick Lokama third in the 1200-yard run. John Gritman fourth in the low hurdles. Lloyd Koonen tie for fourth in the pole vault. Munsell shared a three-way tie for fourth in the high jump and placed fourth in the 330-yard run, and Baggett got a fourth in the broad jump for Klamath Falls points.
