Douglas Asks U.S. Aid Shift

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J. (AP) — Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas Wednesday said the U. S. should shift the aim of its foreign aid programs to the peasants, instead of the landlord.

He stated that the U. S. is now "supporting corrupt, reactionary regimes, pouring monies behind governments that are vicious governments, wasting the wealth of America trying to underwrite the status quo."

In the Middle East, and Asia "you are either for the landlord or you are for the peasants," the jurist told some 1,500 delegates at a convention of the CIO Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union. His speech was often interrupted by cheers of the labor men.

Unless backed by social and political ideas, technical aid programs will be of "little value in saving that part of the world from Soviet imperialism," he said.

Home Building Aid Offered

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Banking Committee Wednesday sealed down and then approved a bill authorizing federal aid to encourage construction of homes.

As introduced by Chairman Maybank (D-S.C.), the measure called for about 2 1/2 billion dollars worth of incentive such as government insurance on home loans.

The committee trimmed the total authorization to an estimated 1 1/2 billion dollars.

As approved, the bill provides for an additional 400 million dollars worth of government insurance of home loan mortgages under the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) program.

The original bill called for an additional authorization of one billion dollars.

Another section called for providing an additional 100 million dollars for community facilities in defense housing areas. The committee approved 40 million.

Airports OK'd Near Forests

WASHINGTON (AP) — A bill to authorize the federal government to build airports near national forests was approved by the Senate Commerce Committee Wednesday.

The secretary of Agriculture would determine where the airfields are necessary to protect and administer national forests, with approval of the Civil Aeronautics Administrator.

The bill says no sites owned by states, counties or cities would be taken without the consent of authorities involved.
