Three pitchers who've already posted five victories in this year's Pacific Coast League season go to the hill Friday night with two of their meeting heads.

San Diego manager Lefty O'Doul named his starting pitcher Willie Luna, 21-year-old rookie, to try and even the league leaders' series with Los Angeles.
The Angels lead in games 3-1, having won Thursday night 5-4 as close games featured the play, in the others, Sacramento dropped second place Oakland 3-2, San Francisco edged Seattle 5-4 and Hollywood beat Portland 6-4.

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP)—Al Ulbrickson, coach of the University of Washington crews, still pondered his choice for the vixen and junior races against California Saturday as his charges twice tried out the tidal waters of Oakland Estuary.

It appeared likely that, as against Ky Ebright's experienced eight, Ulbrickson would be relying on at least five and probably six sophomores, including stroke Guy Harper, for his varsity.
The fact Ulbrickson still was shifting his men caused no over-confidence on the part of the California coaches.
"If Al didn't think they are fine oarsmen, they wouldn't be in his boat," commented Dave Turner, mentor of the Cal frosh.
