Cascade Locks Drops 1-0 Pitchers' Battle

Big Wayne Rick fashioned a neat two-hitter yesterday in a brilliant duel with Cascade Locks' Bill Arthur as the Malin Mustangs edged the Pirates, 1-0, and earned a berth in the state Class B baseball playoffs.

Malin found just four hits off Arthur but a mighty double by George Ratus in the second out played with an error and a passed ball gave the Mustangs their one big run.

FUMBLE

Two were out when Ratus sent a long ball to center field. He pulled up at second base but slipped on the pitcher's mound and fumbled the ball.

Centerfielder George Nichols was the only Pirate able to solve Rick's tight-hand wizardry. Nichols smacked a single in each of the first and sixth innings, the only hits off the Mustang hurler who has gone undefeated in eight starts this season.

The first was the only frame Rick was in real trouble. Oddly

enough he struck out four batters in the one frame but the Pirates left two on base.

Leadoff man Gary Nichols went down on strikes. So did Correll but Malin Catcher Howard Herringshaw dropped the third strike and Correll reached first base safely.

That's when George Nichols singled to right, scooting Correll around to third.

RACES HOME

Tom Harrison swung at three and two were out. Roger McKinnon did the same thing but luckily he failed to see Herringshaw miff the third strike as Correll raced home.

But Herringshaw didn't pick the ball up in time to tag Correll, just a couple of strides from the plate and the Pirate hustled back to third base.

In the meantime McKinnon had not taken off for first base. Rick spotted the oversteer, picked up the ball in the wild scramble and rifled it to first base to catch McKinnon for the third out.

Rick registered strikeouts five and seven in the second and third innings. The Pirates went down three in a row in a third as Malin's 1-0 lead began to look bigger.

BOBBLE

In the fourth, George Nichols reached first in the leadoff spot when Malin Second-baseman Arby Paris bobbed an easy roller.

But Rick caused Harrison to pop up, whiffed McKinnon, and then hit David McClure with a pitch to put two on. Von Ahn struck out to end that threat. The last time the Mustangs were in danger.

Arthur kept the Mustangs well in hand after their run in the second, although Jerry Macken, Gene Evans and Rick managed to slap out singles in the third, fourth and fifth.

Rick struck out 15. Neither the Malin hurler nor Arthur walked a man the entire game, although Rick hit one batter.

Spectators lined the left and right field baselines on the Merrill diamond to watch the pitchers' battle that sends Malin to the four-team playoffs for the state title in Drain May 23 and 24.

Medford Relay Team Disqualified

CORVALLIS — Defending champion Medford was given only an outside chance to retain the Oregon Class A high school track and field title Saturday as teams from 35 schools battled for honors.

Three upstate teams — Grants Pass, Bend and Salem — and Grant, Lincoln and Jefferson of Portland moved into favored spots after Medford's relay team was disqualified in Friday's preliminary.

Qualifying events were held Friday in Classes A and B and two final events were run off in Class B.

Four records were set in the B competition.

Jim Boulter of Rogue River high jumped 5 feet, 10 1/2 inches to break a record that has stood since LePine's Bob Reed ran the 100 yard dash in the qualifying event in 10.2 seconds for a new Class B record.

Ken Aldrich of Union ran the hurdles in 21.2 seconds to top a record set at last year's meet.

Dale McCormick of Pleasant Hill broke a shot put record of five years standing with his toss of 49 feet, 2 1/2 inches.

The New York Yankees seldom make a poor trade but at the moment it appears they pulled a whopper in dispatching Frank Shea, Jackie Jensen and Archie Wilson to Washington for Irv Noren.

Yankee Manager Casey Stengel was reluctant to part with the trio but claimed he was forced to gamble. Stengel's fears have been realized and if Noren doesn't pick up the pace of Yankee stadium will have nightmarish.

Shea, Jensen, and Wilson have given the Senators a brighter outlook on life while Noren has yet to catch fire.

Jensen and Shea teamed up Friday night to lead the Senators to a 2-0 triumph over the League-leading Cleveland Indians. The victory moved Washington to within 1 1/2 games of the Tribe.

Shea blew down the Indians on two hits and fanned nine in out-pitching Early Wynn. Jensen drove in both runs with a sixth-inning single.

Noren played his best game since joining Yankees, driving two runs as the Bombers edged the Tigers, 3-2 in Detroit. Noren socked his first homer in the seventh and singled home the winning run with one out in the ninth.

Earl Harris and Satchel Paige combined to pitch the St. Louis Browns to a 2-1 two-hit ten-inning victory over Boston in a night game at St. Louis. The Browns collected only four hits off Mickey McDermott and Ellis Kinder, but three of the blows were by Bob Nieman who drove in both runs. Nieman homered in the eighth and doubled with two on in the tenth to win the game.

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
