HST Demands Defense Fund

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman confronted Congress Saturday with a demand that he vote every dollar the administration has asked for defense, lest the mobilization program falter and the nation be plunged into World War III.

"To win the cold war Congress must give what we ask," the President told a national armed forces day dinner here Friday night.

He branded as "poppycock" the argument that defense spending will bring on national bankruptcy. He said the only citizens who have suffered in the defense effort so far are the men fighting in the Korean war and their families.

"You must not do anything that will cause those men to get shot in the back," Truman said.

The Senate has not yet acted on the defense appropriation bill the President referred to, but the House last month cut the total sharply.

The President asked for \$52,921,022,770 for the 12 months beginning July 1. The House cut this to \$45,297,177,554, a 9.2 per cent reduction.

\$Million Oil Fire Stopped

CORPUS CHRISTI, Tex. (AP)—A million-dollar oil fire which had burned all night in this coastal city was extinguished shortly after dawn Saturday.

Foamite—a carbon dioxide extinguisher which "suffocates" fire by depriving it of oxygen—aid the trick. Two hundred thousand pounds of foamite in five-gallon cans arrived from Houston early Saturday.

The fire-dousing substance was quickly applied to what was left of a blaze already near the point of burning itself out.

At least two of the ten burning tanks on the General American Tank terminal were of the 80,000 barrel variety.

Such tank farm fires rarely are dangerous unless great quantities of gasoline are stored in the area. Large earthen dams surround the huge tanks and contain the oil when tanks give way in the heat.
