

Service Pay Boost Signed

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman has signed the bill boosting pay and allowances in the military services by nearly half a billion dollars a year.

The White House announced the signing Tuesday. It came in time — Truman had until the end of this month — for the raises to become effective with this month's pay vouchers.

Intended to help offset higher living costs, they range from \$3 monthly for privates and seamen to \$65 for two-star generals and admirals.

They apply to approximately 3 1/2 million active as well as retired personnel.

In the final version of the legislation, there was no provision, such as the Senate once voted, to give an extra \$45 monthly to men who are fighting in or have fought in Korea.

This may be taken up later under a separate measure.

The pay raise bill calls for a flat boost of 4 per cent in base pay of all personnel and an increase of 14 per cent in allowances for food and rental.

It would give the average low-ranking enlisted man a \$3 monthly raise, or 4 per cent of the present \$75 pay. Most of these men have no dependents and their food and lodging are furnished by the government, so the majority are not affected by the increase in allowances.

For enlisted personnel with dependents, the monthly increase in pay and allowances would range from \$13 to \$19.

Ike Says Duty Call Answered

THE HAGUE, The Netherlands (AP) — Gen. Eisenhower told the Dutch cabinet Tuesday he came to Europe out of a sense of duty and that is the only way he would accept public office in the U.S.

The retiring NATO commander made the statement when he appeared before the cabinet in the last in his series of farewell appearances in European NATO capitals.

At the end of the month he returns to the United States, where he is a candidate for the Republican presidential nomination.

Eisenhower made the remark about his candidacy in response to an address by Premier Willem Drees, who said "You are going home to face an election to find out what fate has in store for you."

"You have completed successfully your job of laying the ground work of NATO and now you aspire to the highest office in the United States can bestow."

Eisenhower said he would like to make a correction in the Premier's statement.

"I aspire to no public office in the United States, and will only accept one out of a sense of duty," he declared.

"That sense of duty must be communicated to me by the great political party to which I have given such allegiance as a soldier can."

Push Button Era Speeded

CLEVELAND (AP) — A 500-horsepower electric motor which can shift forward to reverse in eight tenths of a second may speed the coming of push button factories.

The motor was hailed as "the beginning of the power for the automatic factory" Monday by Reliance Electric & Manufacturing Co. which developed it.

An electronic control can stop the big motor in three revolutions and send it spinning in the opposite direction.

It is this feature that puts the motor high in plans for factories which would use a minimum of machinery and a minimum of workers.

Reliance already has sold three of the motors, two for punch presses and one for a high-speed tool mill cutoff. Each cost about 50 thousand dollars.

Gen. Ridgway Studies Job

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, a veteran leader of fighting troops in World War II and Korea, began Tuesday an intensive one-week course in how to build up and command a stand-by Allied army in Europe.

He will get advice from President Truman, military and diplomatic representatives of the United States and 13 other member nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) and United Nations officials.

In this week, Ridgway also will tell senators his plans for taking over as new supreme commander of NATO forces, the job Gen. Eisenhower is leaving to enter the

Republican presidential nomination campaign.

The Senate Armed Services and Foreign Relations Committees, which invited Ridgway to appear before them, also are expected to ask him about affairs in the Far East, particularly the prisoner-of-war incidents on Koje Island.

The capture and release of Brig. Gen. Francis T. Dodd by Red prisoners occurred during Ridgway's last week in Japan and just before he turned over his command to Gen. Mark Clark.

Ridgway arrived here by plane Monday night and told reporters, "I have a very crowded week ahead." He said he would "report to my superiors and learn much of my new assignment in Europe."
