Bogged Couple Found Alive

ORANGE, Tex. (AP) — A Vinton, La., couple lost in a Sabine river swamp north of Orange since Sunday afternoon were found alive Tuesday in mud up to their armpits.

They are Mr. and Mrs. M. B. (Jonnie) Johnson, both about 35. They were reported in serious condition from exposure.

More than 200 persons, equipped with boats, an airplane and short wave radio had searched for the couple.

The Orange sheriff's office said that A. Block of Fort Arthur, Tex., who owns a fishing camp in the area where the couple disappeared, located the two.

They were carried in a Louisiana highway police car to a hospital in Lake Charles, La., where attendants said their condition was "fair."

Toke Norquist, Orange who assisted in the search, said the Johnsons were in mud up to their armpits.

They had set out on the Sabine in a small home-made skiff Sunday at 2 p.m.

It was learned that swift current jammed the boat between two trees at the water's edge and the Johnsons abandoned it. They became lost.

Couple Injured As Car Upsets

A Lancaster, Calif., man and wife were injured Monday afternoon when their north bound car overturned several miles south of Dorris on U.S. Highway 97.

Hospitalized Monday night at Klamath Valley Hospital was Mrs. Ellis (Lucille) Fox, 22, with head cuts and a broken collarbone.

Woodworkers Working Again

PORTLAND (AP) — Columbia River district CIO Woodworkers, on strike for three weeks for an improved contract, began returning to logging camps and mills Tuesday.

The Columbia Basin Loggers and Sawmill organization, which withdrew from the Lumbermen's Industrial Relations Committee—all employers' group—announced the settlement affecting some 8,000 workers on the lower river.

The new agreement provides for a 7 1/2-cent hourly wage increase, a 2-cent increase in night differentials, three additional paid holidays and an improved vacation program.

Workers will continue to finance a health and welfare program but with some changes in payroll deduction. The union had demanded that employers pay for the health and welfare program.

CLEMENTON, N.J. (AP) — "I saw they were in trouble so I jumped in and pulled them out."

That statement, spoken in Danish, tells the story of the rescue Tuesday of two small boys from Clementon Lake by a 16-year-old Danish youth who arrived in America four days ago.

The Danish youth, Yohan Svendrup, was on his way to the grocery store. As he passed by the lake he noticed the two boys, Daniel Wayne, 3, and Francis Welsh, 3 1/2, playing by the water.

Later on the way back from the store he saw the boys thrashing about in the water. He dropped the groceries, removed his shoes and stockings and jumped in.

He dragged the Wayne boy ashore and then returned for the Welsh child. Later all three were treated for exposure.

Yohan, his widowed mother, two sisters and a brother are living with his aunt until they find a permanent home.
