SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Archie Moore, St. Louis' KO'd Bob Dunlap, Oakland, Calif., in the sixth round Monday night, then listened quietly while his manager virtually challenged the world.

"Archie will fight anybody," manager Charlie Johnston said of the No. 1 contender for the light heavyweight championship. "But nobody wants him. When we offered Moore to Rocky Marciano, Al Weill (International Boxing Association) turned white."

# CONGDON WINS, WAIVES PGA BERTH

PORTLAND (AP) — Charles Congdon of Tacoma won the Pacific Northwest Professional Golfers Organization title Monday but Frank Newell, also of Tacoma, will be the Northwest's No. 1 entrant in the PGA championships at Louisville, Ky., next month.

Tied with two-under-par 144s at the end of 36 holes Monday, Congdon and Newell played an extra hole. Congdon won the playoff with a par 5 to Newell's 6.

Congdon said he had decided not to compete in the Louisville championships and Newell took his place as the top Northwest entry.

The second tournament post was titled by John Langford, Portland, who won a playoff among three fifth place winners after Eddie Hogan and Larry Lamberger of Portland also elected not to compete in the PGA. Hogan and Lamberger tied for third with 147s.

Others in the playoff were Ray Honsberger, Clarkston, Wash., and Dave Killen, Olympia, who later qualified as first and second alternates, respectively.
