LaMotta Decisions Hairston

10-Round Verdict Unanimous

DETROIT (AP) — At Jake LaMotta's age you can't fight slambang for 10 full rounds against a dancing youngster like Eugene (Silent) Hairston. So how did the 30-year-old Bronx Bull gain his unanimous decision over Hairston in a 10-round slugfest match here Wednesday night?

"That's easy. I paced myself," grinned the happy veteran of 12 ring years who outweighed 22-year-old Hairston 166 to 160 1/2 pounds.

"That's my best fight since I started the comeback." However, Jake, former middleweight champion, couldn't explode his once-lethal right when he got Hairston in trouble. One of his few good right hands jarred the deaf mute Negro in the eighth round but Hairston clinched and was all right before Jake could move in again.

Jake, aiming for a light heavyweight title fight or a battle against the winner of the Randy Turpin-Don Cockell fight, saved most of his windmill clouting for the last 30 to 45 seconds of each round.

Thesz Claims Mat Crown

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Wonderful peace settled over the National Wrestling scene Thursday and Los Angeles reaffirmed its claim as a place of astonishing events.

Twenty-five thousand, 263 persons turned out to see a wrestling show Tuesday night and they paid \$103,277.75 for the privilege. Wrestling people say the marks were the greatest ever.
