Because I was the only missionary in Northeast Shantung, all mission responsibility fell on me. In 1951 all was changed. All was worse. New government regulations came. No mission money could be accepted.

I learned a little how Christ was denied and bore unwarranted treatment through eight weeks of being charged as a spy, becoming a hunted criminal, subject to arrest at any moment, night or day, all with intense, inflaming newspaper publicity.

I learned I was to be mobbed, when God unexpectedly intervened. I was taken in the middle of the

night and put aboard ship bound for Hong Kong. Mission property and station wagons were confiscated. Moscow radio broadcasts announced the spy ring was cracked. The local government was honored. If I had decided not to stay when the others left I would never

Have known the terror, pressure and suffering of the Chinese church. This has since increased for them. Miss Forsythe, who has been a guest in local churches suffered ill health during the last months of her stay in China. She returned to New York the

slow way through Europe and hopes to visit the west at some later date. She asks that the churches do not forget the Chinese churches and that constant prayers be offered for release from the Communist terror.
