Stocks

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market Thursday pushed up to around the highest average level of the year on the basis of strong demand for railroads and coppers. Gains ran from fractions to between 1 and 2 points throughout the day with selective demand pushing a few favorites up more than 5 points at times.

Volume expanded to an estimated 1,400,000 shares. Railroads rushed ahead after Southern Pacific directors declared a dividend of \$1.50 as against \$1.25 previously and quarterly and proposed a two-for-one stock split.

Trading in Southern Pacific was suspended for about 45 minutes while an orderly market was arranged under supervision of stock exchange intermediaries. It reopened on a block of 1,700 shares up 3 1/2 at 77 3/4, and it continued up for a gain of around 5 points at times.

Poppy Sales This Weekend

The American Legion's annual Poppy Day is scheduled for this weekend, Friday and Saturday, with the familiar red paper poppies being sold on downtown streets.

Mrs. William Badker is poppy chairman for Klamath unit of the American Legion Auxiliary.

Mrs. Badker said that disabled war veterans are making the symbolic flowers, crepe paper replicas of the wild poppies which grew in World War I cemeteries in France and Belgium.

Approximately 10,000 men, working in beds, wheel chairs and hobbling by shops in veterans hospitals, have been given employment this year by the American Legion, making 30,000,000 of the flowers. They to be sold in Klamath Falls were made at Camp White, near Medford.

Materials are supplied by the American Legion Auxiliary and the veterans engaged in making the poppies are paid out of Auxiliary funds.

Trees Salvaged By Canby Men

ALTURAS — Don Myrick and Kenneth Pringle, both of Canby, Calif., are carrying on a salvage operation of dead and downed trees in the Glass Mountain area of the Modoc National Forest.

Their work was started for the purpose of clearing out recent wind-falls, but has been extended to the cutting of merchantable portions of standing dead trees as well as down logs and trees in the area.

The windfalls would be of no use if left on the ground for another year.

Road Surface Bids Sought

The State Highway Commission is scheduled to call for bids on the job of surfacing the state secondary highway on the west side of Upper Klamath Lake next Monday.

The job consists of 18.16 miles of grading, surfacing and oiling, starting at the end of the present pavement near the Geary Ranch and extending up to near the present Lake of the Woods turnoff.

The road is to be completely realigned to eliminate several grades and switchbacks.

A 12-mile section of the job has been bid on three times in the past two years, and the bids reflected as too high.

The 12-mile section extends from the Geary Ranch to Howard's Bay on Upper Klamath Lake.

Present plans for the work call for a new alignment east of the present road up to Howard's Bay, then another alignment on the west side of the present road for six miles up to near the Lake of the Woods junction.

Also included in construction of a 150-foot bridge over the Geary Canal about a mile east of Howard's Bay is the lake of the present bridge.

The roadway is to have a 20-foot oiled surface with two-foot gravel shoulders on a cinder and gravel base and serve as an all-year access for farm crops, timber and recreational use on the west side of the lake.
