## Torture Death Apology Made

FLORENCE, Italy (AP) — The city of Florence made public amends Friday for the hanging and burning of a Dominican monk whose defiance threatened a schism in the Roman Catholic church 434 years ago.

The fiery preacher, Girolamo Savonarola, was excommunicated by Pope Alexander VI, who later said Savonarola should be included among the saints.

Mayor Giorgio La Pira publicly apologized Friday to St. Mark's Monastery for the execution of Savonarola and his two companions on May 23, 1498.

For the first time since then, the Dominicans of St. Mark's were again permitted to enter the church of old Palazzo Vecchio, from which they had been barred by the powerful Medici family that had been opposed by Savonarola.

It was in this chapel that the reformer received his last communion before being tortured and forced to say he was not a prophet.

Students of Florence scattered white flowers on the spot where the famous Dominican, who led a crusade against luxury and for humility, was burned.

## Western Band Disapproving Coming Here

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — An 89-year-old man who spent his summers with the Indians in the Rogue River region of Oregon, died here Thursday.

He was Henry Clifford Fowler Stuart, but he went by the name of X Stuart and Stuart X. Both these were listed in the telephone directory.

He called himself a philosopher and said he disapproved of civilization. Some 10 years ago he had small cards printed and these he passed around to questioners as his "obituary."

These explained that he had dropped all names except his last "and annexed an X to mark his unknownness."

"Growing more and more tired of 'la comedie humaine'— 'Aspiration: to avoid reincarnation'."

He helped his father, Col. John Stuart, a Civil War veteran, build railroads in Guatemala and Honduras, and remained to operate them. He came to Berkeley in 1924 after his retirement. He corresponded with such men as George Bernard Shaw.

His estate amounted to about \$200,000, his family said.

## Plane Crash Takes 2 Lives

CHEYENNE (AP) — Two men were killed in a light plane crash 10 miles southeast of here Thursday, one a Warren Air Force Base airman.

The airman was identified as Staff Sgt. George D. Cormie, Central Point, Ore. He is survived by a wife, Dixie, of Cheyenne, and his father, David T. Cormie of Central Point.

Authorities identified the Cheyenne man as Joseph E. Stagner, 24, married and the father of two children.

According to Wyoming Aeronautics Director George Nelson, the airman was receiving civilian flight instruction from Stagner.

The small plane apparently slammed nose-first into the ground.

Laramie County Coroner Robert Grace said both men were killed instantly.

## Immigration Curbs Argued

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate, with few members present, Thursday night shouted approval of new immigration legislation.

Sen. McCarran (D-Nev.), sponsor of the bill, told the Senate its 302 pages revising, unifying and adding to present immigration law were necessary to protect the American way of life.

Opponents of the measure, during a week of often bitter debate, called it harsh, unduly restrictive and similar to Nazi racial ideology.

The bill now goes to conference with the House, which passed a similar measure last month, 206 to 68. The Senate passed it on a voice vote.

**CHIEF FOES**

Sen. Lehman (D-Lib. N.Y.) and Humphrey (D-Minn.), who led the opposition, said before passage they hope President Truman will veto the bill if it reaches him. Just before giving up his fight, by announcing he would not press on with a bulky stack of proposed amendments, Humphrey told the Senate the opposition will have enough votes to sustain a veto.

If a conference committee agrees upon a single bill to be presented to both houses, the revising measure must be approved in both House and Senate before going to the President.

**PROVISIONS**

The bill as passed by the Senate includes these provisions:

1. It would retain the present immigrant quota system, based upon U. S. population makeup in 1920.
2. It would increase slightly the number of immigrants eligible for admission each year.
3. Naturalization laws would be revised.
4. Immigrants with needed skills would get preferential treatment.
5. Bars against Asians would be lifted, but strict limits would be imposed upon the number of Asians who may enter the country.

## Explosions Alarms Portland People

PORTLAND (AP) — Alarmed residents of North and Northeast Portland reported explosions Wednesday afternoon and again Thursday morning.

In each case Portland Air Base officials said it was jet planes flying overhead near the field in the Northeast section. On occasion diving planes create sounds like an explosion on the ground.
