Portland TV Bid Studied

WASHINGTON — Portland, Ore., will be one of the first big cities in the country without television to have its applications for new stations processed.

Portland was included on the priority list of top cities from which the Federal Communications Commission will begin processing applications July 1.

The applications from cities without local TV service were listed by population according to the last census and the commission said applications would be processed in that order.

The cities were divided into two groups with equal priority. Portland is in the A-2 group which includes cities eligible for both ultra high frequency and very high frequency channel assignments.

Among other cities listed in the group with Portland are Denver, Spokane, Wash., and Sacramento, Calif. Denver was listed first, Portland second, Spokane eighth and Sacramento twelfth.

Unemployment Wages New Mark
SALEM — Wages paid last year to workers covered by the Oregon unemployment compensation law totaled \$1,210,000,000, the Unemployment Commission said Wednesday.

The total, a new record, was 15 per cent greater than the previous high in 1950.
