Utley Death Time Check

Raymond Utley, whose battered body was found in a pasture on his ranch below Lorella Saturday, apparently died Friday morning. He was gored to death by a 1900-pound bull in the pasture. Sheriff Red Britton and Deputy Coroner Clarence Ward examined the body and learned that Utley, who lived alone, had been doing some work on a bunkhouse at a neighboring ranch but had failed to come to work Friday morning. Apparently he went into the pasture at the far end of his 160 acres and was attacked by the bull. The ground was turned up for several yards around Britton said, where the animal had tossed and trampled the 49-year-old man. Every bit of his clothing had been ripped off. Utley was found in the pasture Saturday morning by neighbors Fred Hilton and Dan Cleary.

Dard's Funeral Home was arranging to send the body to Fort Jones. The woman's body was found hanging in the bathroom of her residence Saturday shortly before noon by Sheriff Red Britton. Mrs. Erickson, a widow, had operated a small grocery at her home, 615 N. 2nd, for 14 years.

However, she was crippled from

an injury and suffered from arthritis, and a note found at the house said her hands had grown "stiff and weak" and that she feared her whole body would soon be affected. Relatives had been trying to persuade her to go to a rest home to live.
