Albany, Gervais Win Baseball Crowns

Mustangs Lose To Creswell

Albany and Gervais are the new Oregon high school baseball champions.

Albany, the host team, won the Class A tournament by defeating Roosevelt of Portland 9-1 Saturday night.

Gervais defeated Boardman 4-1 for the Class B championship at Drain.

The Dalles won third place in the A division by blanking Lincoln of Portland 1-0. Creswell, which shut out Malin 7-0, was the B tournament third place winner.

Albany, the first upstate tournament winner in the last seven years, collected seven runs in the third inning of the title game. Pitcher LeRoy Babcock limited the Mustangs to five hits and collected two of his team's eight hits.

John McCall, who rapped out a one-run homer and Bob Bannick who collected two singles, led the Gervais hitting attack. Boardman was held hitless by hurlers Harry Nosack and Gary Espe.

Houtteman Leads Major League Chase for Hard-Luck Laurels

Art Houtteman, Murry Dickson and Bob Hooper are running neck-and-neck for hard-luck-of-the-year honors.

At the moment, Houtteman is in the fore. The young Detroit twirler dropped a heart-breaker Sunday losing a 1-0 decision to Mary Grissom as the Chicago White Sox twice shut out Detroit. Veteran Joe Dobbson outpitched Virgil Trucks 3-0, in the first game of the double-header.

Hooper also went down 1-0 as the Philadelphia Athletics were held to a split by Washington. The A's drew first blood, defeating the Senators, 2-1, as Bobby Shantz turned in a six-hitter to become the first American League pitcher to win seven games. Lefty Lou

Sleater got Washington even, however, edging out Hooper in the ninth when Pete Runnels drove in the only run of the game with a single that scored Jim Busby.

Dickson, Pittsburgh's gritty right-hander, was within one out of registering his first triumph since April 30 — and only his second of the year — but a two-out home run by Dee Fondy with a man on base in the ninth inning dashed Murry's hopes. The blow came off Dickson's reliever, Ted Wilks, and gave the Chicago Cubs a 5-4 win over the Pirates.

Cleveland earned a split with the St. Louis Browns, winning the nightcap, 6-2, after Rogers Hornsby's men had taken the opener, 7-5. The split left the front-running Indians still three games ahead

of Washington and the Boston Red Sox, now tied for second place.

In the only other action, the St. Louis Cardinals defeated the Cincinnati Reds, 7-6, when Tommy Glaviano drove home Del Rice with a double in the seventh inning. Rain washed out the second game. The elements also postponed games between the New York Yankees and Red Sox, Brooklyn and Philadelphia and the Boston Braves and New York Giants.

Furillo In Slump

Trojans Clobber PCC Foes in Cinder Meet

EUGENE (AP) — The University of Southern California came through as expected Saturday, and won its 12th consecutive Pacific Coast Conference track and field championship.

Faced by Jim Iness, who threw the discus 183 feet 5 1/4 inches—farther than it has been thrown in this country before—and Jack Davis who placed first in both the high and low hurdle events, USC piled up 62 1-3 points. Stanford had 35, California 20 5-6, UCLA 20, Washington State 19 1/2, Oregon 19, Oregon State 18 1-3, Washington 14 and Idaho 6.

Iness' discus throw, made in the qualifying round, will be submitted for recognition as an American record.

USC won seven events and tied for first in another. Washington State and UCLA each won two events. Oregon won one and tied one and Oregon State and Idaho each won one.

Washington State's Bob Carey provided an upset in the 100-yard dash by winning in 9.9 seconds over favored Rod Richard of UCLA. The other USC winner was Al Fisher, who turned in his best performance of the year in winning the two-mile run in 9:24.7.

Ralph Sutton of Oregon State won the javelin with the best throw of his life—224 feet 2 1/4 inches. Chuck Missfeldt, of Oregon, favored to win, was second with a throw of 223 feet 10 inches. Sutton's throw makes him a likely candidate for the U. S. Olympic team.

Dave Martindale of Idaho won the pole vault with a 14 foot 2 3/4 inch leap. Lyle Dickey of Oregon State was second with a 14 foot jump.

Erery Barnes of Oregon and Manuel Ronquillo of USC tied for first place in the high jump at 6 feet 5 1/2 inches. Jack Hutchins was Oregon's other winner. He ran the 880 in 1:54 minutes.
