State Road Contracts Total Near \$3 Millions

PORTLAND (AP)—Contracts totalling nearly 3 million dollars for highway repairs and construction were awarded by the State Highway Commission in a two-day meeting here.

In addition, 2 1/2 million dollars worth of contracts were referred to the highway department engineers for possible later award.

Another quarter million dollars worth of bids were rejected.

Largest project to come before the commission was grading and paving and construction of five bridges on the Corvallis-Newport Highway. McNutt Bros., Eugene,

submitted the low bid of \$963,787 on the project. The bid was referred to the engineer.

REJECTS

Among bids rejected were: Acme Construction Co., Eugene, \$26,319, for grading and paving in the cities of Hiddle and Glendale in Douglas County.

Ray L. Houck & Son, Salem, \$210,444, for grading and paving a section of the Hayesville School-Turner Road Unit on the Salem by-pass section of Pacific Highway.

In other action the commission: Withheld recommendation on a petition from the Lane County Recreation Committee for development by the Highway Department of recreation facilities at Dorena Dam. The matter will be studied further.

Told Southern Oregon civic groups, including the Grants Pass Chamber of Commerce, that it would not be possible to convert the Grants Pass Caveman Bridge into a four-lane span.

SCENIC SAVING

Referred to the park superintendent for further study a request for a policy statement on preserving scenic attractions in the Columbia River Gorge.

Rejected a demand that the commission withdraw its offer to pay \$750,000 for property in Portland's Sullivan Gulch which will become the Bantfield Expressway. H. E. Carlson, secretary of the Sullivan's Gulch Highway Committee, said the property was worth only \$250,000.

Deer Crashes Door, Killed

OREGON CITY (AP)—A frightened deer jumped through the door of the E. G. Harvey accounting firm here Tuesday.

The plate glass door was closed though and the deer severely injured, had to be killed.

It apparently had walked into the city from the nearby Newell Creek Canyon. It first walked up onto a porch of a home in the northeast district.

The lady of the house called the police. Then she, the police and neighborhood dogs, started after the deer.

Frightened it ran into one of the city's main streets and then jumped through the plate glass door.
