Death Takes Ad Executive

NEW YORK (AP) - Albert Davis Lasker, 72, advertising expert and one-time chairman of the United States Shipping Board, died Friday.

Lasker was owner of Lord and Thomas, one of the country's leading advertising agencies, until he liquidated the company upon his retirement from active business in December 1942.

During World War I he served as special assistant to the secretary of agriculture by appointment of President Wilson.

He was assistant chairman of the Republican National Committee from 1918 to 1920.

President Hoover appointed him chairman of the shipping board in 1921.

With his wife he founded the Albert and Mary Lasker Foundation, educational and medical foundation, and served as its president.
