

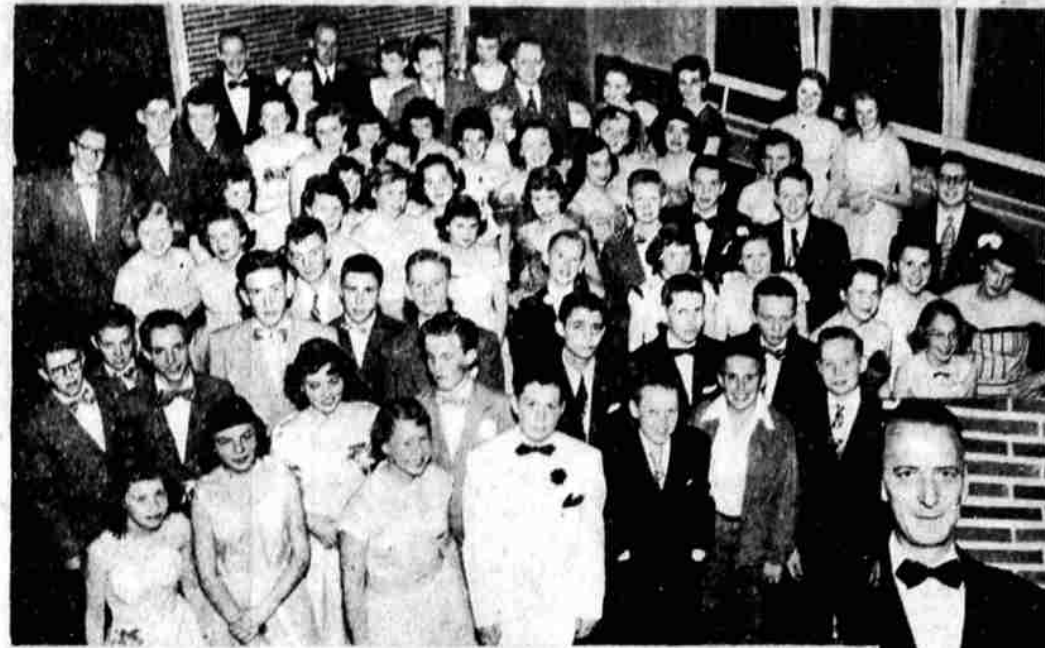
"Blossom Time" Theme of Party
