Attempt Strike Settlements

PORTLAND—Attempts were to be made Monday to settle two Oregon labor disputes.

AFL food and drug clerks were scheduled to meet in the afternoon with grocery store operators and a federal mediator in an effort to avert a strike.

George Lightowler, union secretary, said the clerks would strike at midnight if no agreement is reached on wages and a health and welfare program.

Representatives of some 150 AFL bus drivers and Oregon Motor Stages were to hold their first negotiating meeting since a strike began more than three weeks ago.

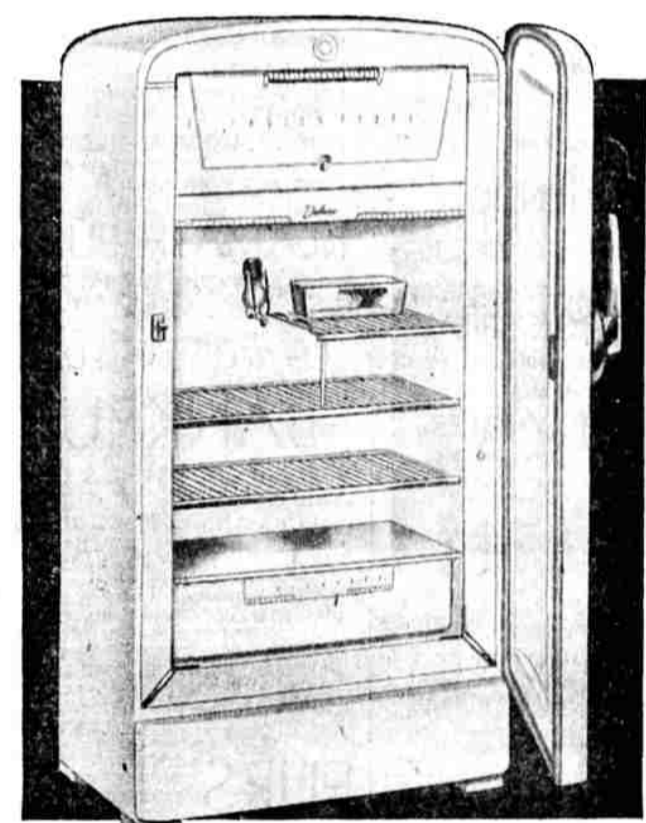
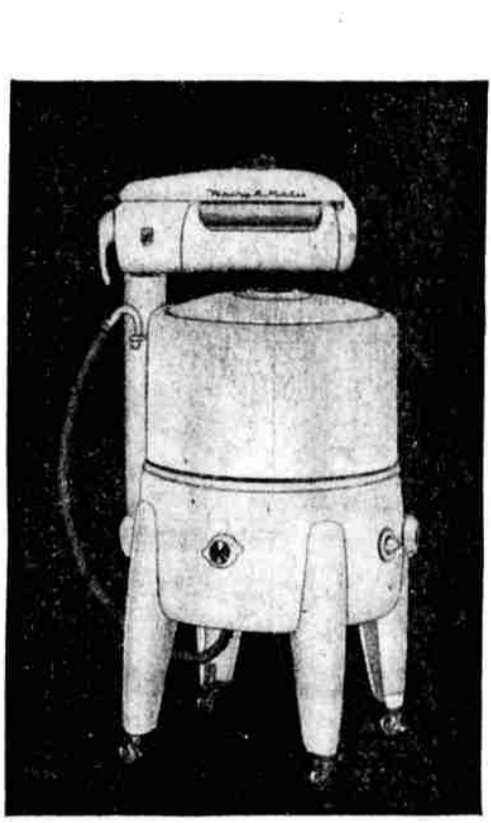
