Crusading Congressman Confused by Television

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Gathings (D-Ark.) noted Tuesday that the necklines on the dresses of television actresses are higher since the industry adopted a TV code this spring.

The sandy-haired Arkansas congressman was the first witness before a House Commerce subcommittee opening an investigation of radio and TV.

Payday Due For Postal Workers

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senators and congressmen got together Tuesday in a move to speed up pay day for 400,000 postal workers set back by a congressional row over the steel seizure.

Rep. Cannon (D-Mo.), a member of the House Appropriations committee, told a reporter he expected both the House and Senate to pass a bill Tuesday to supply the money to pay the postal workers. But the House adjourned without taking action on the matter.

It adjourned after a 30-minute session because of lack of a quorum. About 75 of the 432 members were on hand.

Paychecks for the postal employees were held up because a bill to provide funds for a score of government departments and agencies in the fiscal year that began July 1 had not yet been enacted.

The reason, the Senate tacked an amendment to the measure — known as the third supplemental appropriation bill — requiring that none of the funds be used to enforce the steel seizure order. The House refused to go along with the restriction.

The bill, carrying about 970 million dollars, languished in committee.

Congressional Leaders Urge Aid Bill Approval

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressional leaders Wednesday called for early approval of a foreign aid bill authorization bob-tailed about 1 1/2 billion dollars below the \$7,900,000,000 President Truman asked.

The \$5,447,730,750 compromise omnibus measure was agreed upon late Tuesday by a Senate-House Conference Committee which adjusted all differences in a single day.

Actual appropriation of the money will be covered in a separate appropriation bill, and in past years this has meant further reductions. The House Appropriations Committee has started hearings on this measure.

PORTLAND (AP) — Four college students who police said admitted shooting six bullets into a parked car "while just playing around" were charged Tuesday with riot.

None of the bullets hit Jack Saunders, 17, or his 17-year-old high school girl companion, occupants of the parked car in the Friday night shooting.

Police said the boys told them they had consumed a case of beer. One of the boys, Michael Armstrong, 19, Oregon City, a student at Portland University, said he was ill and did not participate in the shooting.

The other three are William K. Whitlock, 18, and Robert Burdick, 19, of the University of Oregon, and Ronald K. Arnold, 20, Portland University, all residents of Portland.
