# Portland Grocer Strike Averted

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government Thursday halted the export of all steel mill products except those essential to direct military production of the United States or friendly countries, or essential to direct defense—supporting industries.

The action was taken by the Commerce Department because of the strike which has cut off new production by the nation's steel mills. It follows an embargo already placed on warehouse deliveries of steel to U. S. producers of consumer goods. The Department's office of international trade said the order would be effective until further notice.


