Recipe

Its bright red-orange color adds a cheery note whenever served.

- 3 lbs. (30 medium) apricots
- 2 cups loganberries
- 1 pkg. (2 1/2-oz.) powdered fruit pectin
- 9 cups Sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract

Wash, halve, pit unpeeled apricots; put through food chopper, using coarse knife. Measure 4 1/2 cups. Sort, wash, drain loganberries. Combine fruits and pectin in large preserving kettle. Bring rolling boil, over high heat, stirring constantly. Blend in sugar as mixture brought back to a rolling boil. Boil 1 or 2 minutes. Remove from heat; skim. Stir in extract. Pour into hot, sterilized jars; paraffin at once. Makes about 5 pints.

LARAPIN' GOOD

You can't beat a hot fudge sundae when it comes to pleasing the young crowd. Impress the gang with one made this way. Put a scoop of ice cream in the bottom of a dish, over with the hot fudge sauce and sprinkle with chopped walnuts. Then for the final blaze of glory, top each with a lump of sugar soaked in lemon extract. Light the sugar cube, turn down the lights and serve flaming.
