The roll call vote was 361 to 1. The lone dissenter was Rep. Devereux (R-MD), a onetime commander of the Marine garrison at Wake Island.

Portland To Have TV Show

PORTLAND (AP) — Portland's four network radio stations will join in bringing a telecast of the (usual) Conventions to the city from Chicago.
The closed circuit showing — sponsored by KGW, KOIN, KPOJ, KEX and Portland television set distributors — will be held in the Oregon National Guard Armory, Frank Coffin, assistant manager of KGW, said.
Earlier KING-TV, Seattle, made arrangements to bring telecasts of the two conventions to the Auditorium here.
Otto Brandt, manager of KING-TV, said the venture by the Portland stations "is good news to us."

He said KING's aim was "to sell television first." Brandt added that Seattle station's owners plan to apply for a Portland TV channel.
The Auditorium can seat about 3,000, while Coffin said the Armory has a capacity of 1,876. No seats will be provided there. Admission to both will be free.
Coffin estimated the cost of bringing the telecasts of the conventions here at \$4,000 to \$5,000.
