

Army to Shift Fort Activities
SEATTLE (AP) — Chamber of Commerce Manager Don Follett said he had received confirmation from Washington that the Army is considering a shift of almost all Fort Lawton's activities to Fort Lewis.

Lawton is the processing base for large numbers of troops going to or coming from the Far East and Alaska. It is inside Seattle.

Follett said Sixth Army headquarters had recommended the shift. He said the chamber will fight the proposal unless "true economy" can be shown.
