

Highlights of Eisenhower Press Conference

ABILENE, Kans., (AP) — Here are the replies given by Gen. Eisenhower Thursday to some of the key questions fired at him by reporters in his first major out-of-uniform news conference.

Question: How do we bring the Korean war to a successful end?

Answer: "I do not have any prescription for bringing the thing to a decisive end because with the

enemy's buildup that is apparently taking place on the other side of the Yalu . . . I don't think it would be possible for our forces to carry through a decisive attack. . . I do not believe we can in the ideological war we are waging, retreat from the area we occupy. . . I believe we have got to . . . try to get a decent armistice out of it.

Q. Whom do you blame for the losing of China?

A. . . . I do not know who is to blame for the loss of China. I do know that the . . . party in power has to take active responsibility for any losses we have suffered, but I could not name a person . . .

Q. Will you support Taft if he is nominated?

A. . . . I will support any Republican ticket that is nominated. . . . On the assumption that their platform is going to be somewhat following the principles stated in their statement of Feb. 6, 1950.

Q. Do you favor a compulsory FEPC?

A. . . . I really believe we can do more by leadership and getting states to do it than make it a federal compulsory thing. . . .

Q. If you are elected, would you be willing to appoint to your cabinet some Negro of competence such as Dr. (Ralph) Bunche?

A. . . . All of the tasks I have held for and on behalf of our government in the past, I searched for the best I could find. Whether or not it would be the best to use Dr. Bunche, I don't know.

Q. In the event a new (Korea) offensive should be launched, would you then consider any bombing attacks into China or blockading the coast?

A. . . . I would not attempt anything beyond our capabilities in the military sense and that has to be decided by people on the spot. But if I am attacked in a broad way . . . I am going to do everything I can to support men that are carrying the battle for me and I am going to do everything I can to win it and as quickly and decisively as I can. . . . There has been built up behind the Yalu river

ing by loose association. . . . I feel right now I have a great responsibility to a lot of people who rightly or wrongly believe I could be of service to the United States in the political world. I am not going to let those people down. I am going to speak out as frankly as I know how. . . .

Q. Are you for compulsory health insurance?

A. . . . I do believe every American has a right to decent medical care. . . . We must in these private universities support medical education by private means, because it is that any kind of Communist, subversive influence be uprooted from responsible places in our government. . . . on the other hand, I believe that can be done. . . . Without besmirching the reputation of any innocent man or condemn-

MacArthur's military capabilities would allow to bar me from seeking access to the finest brains. . . . there is nothing that I experience, that I could find. . . .

Q. What do you regard as the paramount issue of the campaign?

A. . . . The issue is peace and security in the world.

Fliers Try Glider Record

WENATCHEE, Wash. (AP) — Two sailplane enthusiasts were poised here Friday awaiting favorable winds to begin an assault on the world's glider endurance record. With the right winds, they'll spend three days and three nights cruising over this Central Washington community in their motorless two-place plane.

Capt. Earl J. Drew, 26, a U.S. Air Force meteorologist, and Marvin M. Howlett, 24, an accountant who flies glider planes as a hobby, planned to take off Saturday, using westerly winds prevalent over a 12-mile long bluff near East Wenatchee.

Their first goal will be the American record of 12 hours, 3 minutes set at Warm Springs, Calif., in August, 1951. Then they'll go after the world's record of 50 hours, 26 minutes set by two Germans over Rossitten, Germany, in 1938.

Drew said Friday he is confident they will top the German mark and if the wind is right go on to set a "worldwide record" of 76 hours — three days, three nights and four hours.

Fancher Field here will be headquarters for the flight. At night, the fliers will check Wenatchee lights for orientation and during the day they'll watch the face of the sun.

Drew and Howlett tuned up for an attempt on the world record with a seven-hour, 15 minute flight over Wenatchee last weekend.

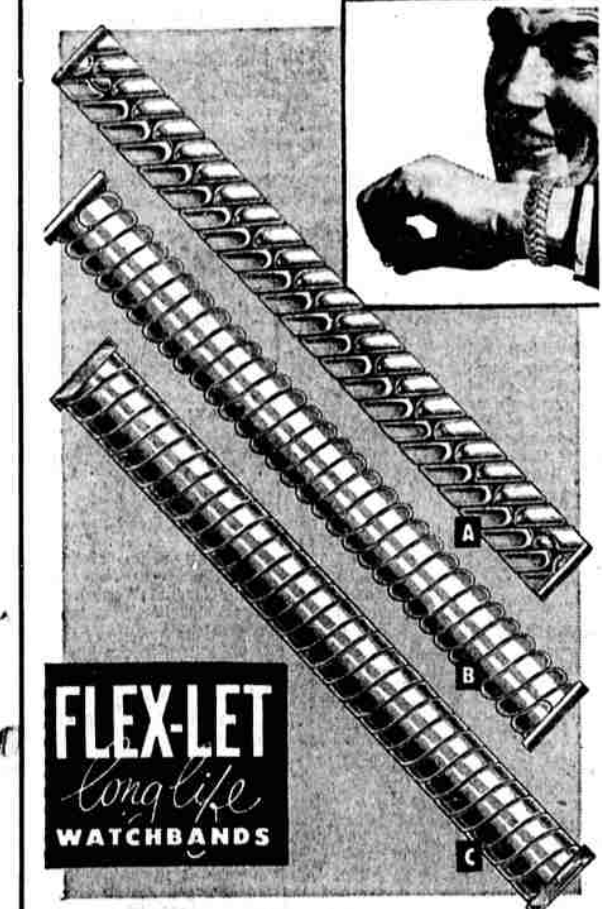
