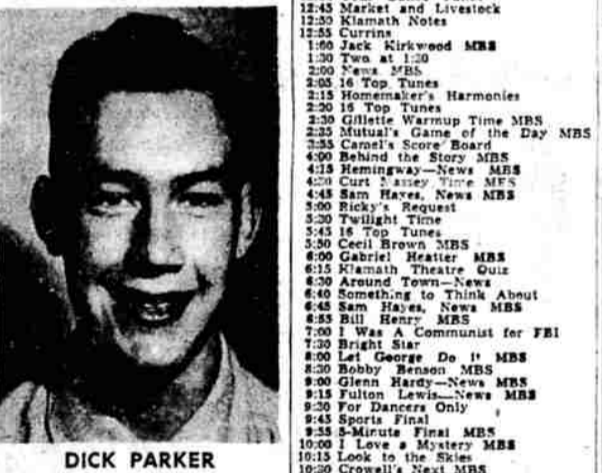

Burned Modoc Hunters Bag Area Reseeded Porcupines

ALTURAS—Mogoc National Forest personnel have completed an intensive hunt for porcupines, with more than 100 being killed in the past few months. Foresters report the animals have done extensive damage by gnawing thousands of young pine trees. The porcupine likes tender young pine bark. They gnaw the tree, thus killing either the tree or the tree's top, and consequently the tree is lost as merchantable timber. About 10 porcupines were taken by direct hunting methods, the foresters report, and about the same number were killed by timber stand improvement crews. The crews reported they were having trouble locating timber damaged by porcupines which they were to prune for clear timber, and the effort to thin the porcupine population was begun.
