Reds Tighten Berlin Squeeze

BERLIN—Border patrols reinforced by Soviet soldiers checked the flight of East Germans to the West Monday as surrounded West Berlin waited apprehensively for the next squeeze of the tightening Communist vice.

The British continued their reprisal siege of Russia's Radio Berlin headquarters inside the city's western sector. Allied patrols were barred by Russians again Monday from Berlin's lifeline highway to West Germany.

But the Russians still evaded attempts to force them into joint discussion of recent harassments. There were weekend rumors that the Soviets were preparing to close three more zonal border crossings between East and West Germany. This would leave the Helmsed- Berlin Autobahn as Berlin's only supply route.

Allied officials said however, that they could find no basis for these rumors. Both road and rail traffic from West Germany to Berlin continued to flow normally.
