## Tension High In Ship Strike

**SAN FRANCISCO** — Tensions between rival waterfront unions mounted as members of the AFL, Masters, Mates and Pilots Union were scheduled to vote Tuesday afternoon whether to picket all non-military ships docking at strike-bound Pacific Coast piers.

Harry Bridges, president of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, told his men "to ignore or remove" any pickets the MMP might post.

The MMP's action came after its deck officers were laid off strike-bound ships. The union charged a lock-out. It turned down an offer by the shipowners' Pacific Maritime Association to employ three officers on a standby basis for each idle ship.

The union said its contract calls for employment of all deck officers at regular wages. The number varies with individual ships.

West Coast ships have been tied up 18 days by the AFL Sailors Union of the Pacific. The SUP is on strike demanding a five per cent wage boost and overtime for Saturday work at sea.

## Lumber Ship Still Aground

**BANDON, Ore.** — Two tugs had taut lines on the grounded lumber schooner Cynthia Olson Tuesday but it appeared hope of freeing her from the Coquille River sand rested with powerful pumps.

There was nine feet of water in her engine room from a hole in her hull. It was punctured while she was battered in rough seas from late Saturday to near midnight Sunday on a rocky bar outside the harbor.

After being pulled free three times, she grounded while being towed up the river. Her crew of 28, in no danger, remained aboard.

Port Manager J. E. Walstrom said the schooner apparently was in no hazard of further damage and the tugs Port of Bandon and Winquatt kept a steady pull on her to keep her bow pointed upstream.

The Winquatt entered the harbor too late to get a tow on the Cynthia Olson at the morning's high tide. However, Walstrom said, enough portable pumps had been put aboard the vessel to move more water than was likely to re-enter through the punctured hull.
