Ed Bouchee, first baseman on the 1952 Washington State College team, was signed by the Spokane Indians Tuesday morning.

Bouchee drove in Spokane's second run in the first inning and crossed the plate with the Indian's final tally in the fifth, Dick Bishop, the winning pitcher, limited the Braves to five hits in racking up his seventh win.
