Hank Paces All-Stars

CHICAGO (AP) — Big Hank Sauer, the Chicago Cubs left fielder who tops the Major League in hitting, is setting a fast pace in the All-Star baseball pool as the fans' most popular player.

Sauer heads the nation-wide balloting in latest tabulations with 24,327 votes, Eddie Robinson, Chicago White Sox first baseman, is next with 23,719. Stan Musial, St. Louis Cardinal center fielder, is third with 23,404.

Voting started last Friday and will continue until midnight June 27. The best vote-getters in the National and American Leagues will start in the All-Star classic at Philadelphia July 8.

Rain Ups Chiefs To Fifth

Wenatchee got an assist from the weatherman Wednesday night and shoeboxed into fifth place in the Western International League. A 3-2 win over Victoria, the loop's pace-setter, posted while Lewiston and the Salem Senators were sitting out a rainstorm pushed the chiefs half a game ahead of the Senators.

Tri-City's Braves, who shared the No. 3 berth with Salem prior to Wednesday night's contests, meanwhile fell to seventh place after dropping a 3-2 decision at Spokane. Vancouver dumped last-place Yakima 4-2 in the third league game.

Salem and Lewiston scheduled a four-inning Thursday. The Chiefs capitalized on Victoria errors to even their series at Wenatchee at a win apiece. Wenatchee broke a 2-2 deadlock in the seventh, tallying three times on three hits and two Victoria bobbles. Victoria outthrew the winners 10-7.

Bob Snyder pitched six-hit ball for Vancouver as the Caplanos made it two-in-a-row over Yakima. The Caps bunched six of their 10 hits off John Albini and scored three runs in the fourth inning and one in the fifth. Yakima's first tally was on Sal Teorina's third inning home run. Mike Donahue singled in the sixth and was doubled home by Dick Brisky for the final marker.

Spokane came from behind in the bottom of the ninth to hand Tri-City its second straight loss. Behind 2-1, the Indians filled the bases as Tri-City pitcher Bob Greenwood walked Wilbur Johnson and gave up a single to Eddie Murphy and an intentional pass to Mel Wasley. Greenwood then walked Ed Bouchee, Washington State College player signed by the Indians Tuesday, to send in the tying run, and Murphy scored with the winning run on a squeeze play.

Sauer's Homers Beat Phillies

No one will dare pick Hank Sauer to sit out the 1952 all-star game. The big fellow from Chicago stands out as the leading slugger in all baseball.

From the trend of the early '52 balloting, Sauer may wind up with the most votes of any player in either league. At least he will if he has many more days like Tuesday.

Sauer, hammered three of "cousin" Curt Simmons' pitches into the left field bleacher area for a 3-2 Cub win over the Phillies.

Sauer's slugging was the big news of the day, although there was much fussing and fuming Tuesday night at St. Louis where both Manager Chuck Dressen and Captain Peeewe Reese of Brooklyn were tossed out of the game with the St. Louis Cardinals. Del Rice's single in the 10th gave the Cards a 3-2 win, slicing the Dodgers' National League lead to four games.

Jim Hearn pitched the New York Giants past Cincinnati, 3-2, with a four hitter and little Murry Dickson of Pittsburgh blanked Boston, 5-0.

The New York Yankees strengthened their American League lead with a 7-2 win over Detroit on Johnny Sain's pitching and home runs by Joe Collins and Yogi Berra.

Washington's Bob Porterfield shut out Cleveland's Bob Lemon, 1-0, to let the Boston Red Sox take over second place with a come-from-behind win over St. Louis 11-9. The Red Sox blasted Bachel Paige for six in the ninth, including a game winning grand slam homer by catcher Sammy White, ex-University of Washington star.

The Philadelphia A's knocked off Chicago, 5-3, on a four-run rally in the sixth that included a two-run homer by Al Clark, filling in for injured Gus Zernial.

The Red Sox explosion was the most dramatic event in the American as it came against Paige, who has been showing fine relief form.

He hadn't allowed a run for 27 innings. Coasting into the ninth with a comfortable 9-5 lead for Marty Marion's new charges, old Satch loaded the bases on two infield singles and a walk. Vern Stephens popped out but Paige walked Billy Goodman to force in a run. Ted Lepcio's single scored another run and White cleaned the bases — the first homer off Paige this season.
