## French Fliers Blast Reds

HONOLULU, Indochina 07 — The French Air Force blasted the Communist-led Vietnam main supply line with Red China Friday in the biggest mass aerial assault since the outbreak of hostilities six years ago.

Fifty-four fighters and 20 American-supplied B-26 bombers roared over colonial route number three, blasting all spans and fords used by the Vietnamese for transporting war equipment and supplies received from China.

Route three has long been the chief Vietnam link with China, over which they have been getting more than 1,000 tons of war equipment and supplies a month.
