New Atom Project Told

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — President A. Whitney Griswold of Yale announced Monday the signing of a contract with the Atomic Energy Commission for the construction at Yale of a new 20 million volt linear accelerator and other important equipment.

The new machine is expected to create a pulsed beam of electrons having a considerably higher electron current than that produced by any similar accelerator now in existence.

In announcing the contract at the annual alumni luncheon, Griswold explained that "it will inaugurate a whole new research program in the field of nuclear physics of the utmost importance to the Yale physics department and of great possible significance to the national defense program."

Yale research physicists plan to operate the new linear accelerator as a pulsed neutron source as a means of measuring the absorption and scattering of various materials for neutrons in the high-energy range.

Such measurements are of vital importance for the design of future nuclear reactors. The machine will also be a powerful source of high-energy X-rays and electrons for experiments on the structure of the nuclei of atoms.

B.C. Politics Stays Muddled

VANCOUVER, B. C. (AP) — It will be July 3 before any attempt can be made to clean up the political shambles left in the wake of British Columbia's general election Thursday.

Though the Liberal government had apparently come down to defeat, it seemed that no other party would be able to pick up a majority of seats in the 48-member legislature.

With the count of first-choice ballots in the alternative voting system still incomplete, election officials said they would not announce the results until the end of the week.

Only six candidates for the Social Credit and one Cooperative Canadian Commonwealth Federation — was indicated.

No left can be thrown on the situation until second choices are counted July 3. Even then, it is possible no party will gain a majority of seats.

With the alternative vote, a candidate must receive a majority of ballots to win. If he doesn't get it on the first count, second, third or fourth choices are tallied according to preferences marked on the ballot by the elector.

The three-week gap between voting day and the second count is to permit time for absentee voters to be allocated to their proper ridings.

Because the first count was indecisive, returning officers took their time tabulating.

If a stalemate results from the election, a temporary minority government, a coalition or a new election seemed the only choices.

Attorney General Gordon Wismer was leading a CCF candidate in Vancouver Center, hinted at a four-party conference but the CCF and Social Credit said they would have nothing to do with any coalition.

Herbert Anscomb, Progressive Conservative leader, predicted a new election might have to be held soon.
