

New Camera Perfected

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) — A technique which permits scientists for the first time to photograph sub-microscopic creatures in their true shapes was reported Monday by a University of California researcher.

The new process already has disclosed that pictures heretofore taken of viruses and perhaps other invisible organisms are not accurate, but rather are flattened and distorted representations.

It also may permit researchers to snap pictures during critical split-second periods that will reveal the step-by-step process in which viruses cause living cells to disintegrate suddenly. This now is one of the deep mysteries of biology.

The technique was developed by Dr. Robley C. Williams, professor of biophysics at the big virus laboratory on the Berkeley campus. He reported it at a meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science here.

The secret of the new method is to freeze-dry the specimen to be photographed in the electron microscope.
