

Ike Shows Huge Lead In Final Oregon State Election Returns

SALEM (AP) — Gen. Eisenhower got 64.53 per cent of the vote in Oregon's Republican Presidential primary a month ago, and California's Gov. Warren is the overwhelming choice of the state's GOP voters for vice president.

The official vote for the Republican contests for President, vice president and convention delegates was announced Monday by Dave O'Hara, chief of the State Elections Division.

Oregon's 18 Republican convention delegates will be pledged to ticket when the convention meets in Chicago July 7.

Eisenhower received 172,486 votes, while Warren placed second with 44,034, or 16.47 per cent.

An Associated Press poll before the election gave Eisenhower 61 per cent of the vote, about 3 1/2 per cent less than he received.

The poll gave Warren 16 per cent, less than 1 per cent off the actual vote.

In third place was Gen. MacArthur with 18,603, or 6.96 per cent. Sen. Taft, whose name wasn't on the ballot, received 18,009 write-in votes, or 6.74 per cent.

The fifth man on the list is Sen.

Wayne Morse, who got 7,105, or 2.66 per cent. Next was Harold Stassen with 6,610, or 2.47 per cent. The low man is William R. Schneider, St. Louis lawyer, with only 350 votes.

Gen. MacArthur, Morse and Taft were unwilling candidates in the state primary.

In the vice presidential balloting, all done by write-in, Warren got 22,467 votes, while Stassen ran second with 3,815. Others were Morse 2,721, MacArthur 1,676, Taft 947, Eisenhower 406, and Thomas E. Dewey 148.

There were 267,310 votes cast for president, or 88.94 per cent of the number of registered voters. This total was slightly larger than had been expected by political observers, who had forecast a 66 per cent vote.

O'Hara also announced the vote for Republican Party offices. Jesse Gard, Portland, was elected National Committeeman with 79,451 votes. Others in the race were Lowell C. Paget, Portland, 62,992; Charles L. Paine, Portland, 57,806; and Glenn R. Jack, Oregon City, 44,677.

Mrs. Marshall E. Cornett, Klamath Falls, was re-elected Republican National Committeewoman without opposition. She got 176,664 votes.

Those elected as the 10 Republican delegates at large were: Gov. Douglas McKay; Sen. Morse; Lamar Toose, Portland; Robert A. Elliott, Medford; Howard C. Belton, Canby; Gordon Orput, Portland; William McAllister, Medford; Mark O. Hatfield, Salem; J. O. Johnson, Tigard, and Frank E. Fowler, Astoria.

The unofficial totals immediately after election showed that Leslie M. Scott and Zylphia Zell Burns, both Portland, had been elected, but the official figures replaced them with Johnson and Fowler.

Delegates elected from congressional districts were:

First, Carl W. Hogg and Mrs. James W. Mott, both Salem; Second, H. H. DeArmond, Bend, and Howard Dent Jr., The Dalles; Third, Tommy Luke and John Morgan, both Portland; Fourth, Lars P. Peterson and William E. Walsh, both Coos Bay.

O'Hara said the rest of the election results would be announced during the next few days.

U.N. Delegates Call Halt To Truce Talks

MUNSAN, Korea (AP) — United Nations truce negotiators walked out on the Communists again Tuesday as the senior Red delegate was talking. They said they wouldn't be back for three days.

North Korean Gen. Nam Il's interpreter was saying "I have something more to say" when Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison declared:

"There being no further business to transact today we are leaving and will return June 21. Our liaison officers are available for necessary meetings."

Brig. Gen. William P. Nuckols, U.N. spokesman, said that when

Harrison walked out the Reds broke out in "apparently rehearsed laughter which was supposed to have been derision, I imagine."

Harrison said "we hope they will think the matter over" and realize that the U.N. proposal for settling the truce blocking issue of prisoner exchange is final.

It was the second time in less than two weeks that Harrison had forced a three-day recess on the Reds in the hope they would reconsider their demand that all captured Reds be repatriated. The U.N. says no prisoner will be

forced to return. Only 70,000 of 169,000 Allied-held POWs have expressed willingness to be repatriated.

Tuesday's walkout came at the end of a 32-minute meeting at which Nam delivered what Harrison called a "bitter and belligerent" propaganda assault on the Allies.

Nam accused the U.N. of trying to "dictate an armistice" and of slaughtering Red prisoners in Allied hands.
