## Stores May Up Prices

**WASHINGTON** (AP)—Department stores now may boost prices on most of their goods starting next Monday.  
The increases allowed range from a penny or two on small items to a dollar or more on furniture, radio and television sets.  
But the Office of Price Stabilization (OPS) doesn't expect most price tags to be used. It said many products now are selling below ceiling and the actual prices are determined by competition.  
OPS authorized the increases Monday to offset a rise in freight and parcel post rates since May, 1951.

## New Paper in Tacoma

**TACOMA** (AP)—Publication of a four-page tabloid newspaper—"The Tacoma Dispatch"—will start here Wednesday. R. U. Buffum announced Monday.  
Buffum, former publisher of the K-Street Shopper, a neighborhood shopping guide, said the tabloid will be published Tuesdays through Saturdays. It will sell daily for three cents a copy, with home delivery 15 cents weekly.  
Buffum said the newspaper will have some local news coverage. Tacoma has been without a daily newspaper since April 12, when the AFL-Pressmen's Union went on strike at the Tacoma News-Tribune.

## Pay Hike For Canneries

**ASTORIA** (AP)—CIO cannery workers Monday accepted a wage increase offered by fish packers here.  
The agreement, calling for pay increases of 4 cents an hour to women workers and 6 to 10 cent hourly increases for men, was reached only a few hours before the 1,500-member union scheduled a strike vote.  
With federal conciliators sitting in, management representatives clarified the welfare plan they ad-plan calls for employers to pay 7 1/2 cents an hour for each worker into an employer-managed health and welfare program.  
The union, however, wants the program to be managed jointly and is asking an employer contribution of 8 1/2 cents an hour for each worker.  
Some 10,000 Western Washington CIO lumber workers are idled by the strike.

A session Monday ended in no progress.

## Georgians OK Russell

**ATLANTA** (AP)—Georgia Democrats Monday named a slate of 28 party officials and instructed them to vote for Sen. Richard B. Russell at the Democratic national convention.  
The Democratic executive committee appointed 72 delegates and alternates, headed by Gov. Herman Talmadge, and including the entire Georgia congressional delegation.  
In addition to voting as a unit for the Georgia senator so long as he desires, the delegation was charged by executive committee chairman James S. Peters to "fight to the last for the rights of Georgia and the South."
